

NITROUS OXIDE USE CANNOT BE IGNORED ANY LONGER

Seán Crowe has criticised Minister Roderic O'Gorman and his government for failing to take the use of nitrous oxide by young people seriously and said that he would persist with the passage of his own legislation on the issue in spite of the Minister's lack of support.

Teachta Crowe said "I had written to Minister Roderic O'Gorman in April last year about a piece of legislation I was bringing forward to ban the sale of nitrous oxide to under-18s in an effort to combat the widespread and dangerous use of the gas by young people as a narcotic.

TD for Dublin South West I received a response just before Christmas to tell me that, in his view, the current legislation is working fine and that my Bill was somehow unnecessary.

> "This naïve, head in the sand approach completely flies in the face of what I am hearing from gardaí that the current legislation is ambiguous and that they do not always know where they stand in relation to seizing canisters of gas from young people when they suspect they will be used to get high

"We will all have seen the canisters littering our public spaces after they are

discarded. The use of this gas has led to death and serious long-term harm to people who have used it to achieve a quick high. It is predominantly young people who use it as it is cheap and easily accessible. My Bill would seek to put an end to that.

"I will be pressing ahead with my Bill in spite of the Minister's support as there needs to be a full debate on the use and availability of nitrous oxide and the risks it poses. The use of nitrous oxide in greater quantities is on the rise and the Minister and his government cannot continue to ignore the issue."

ONE YEAR ON: URGING STRONGER STAKEHOLDER ACTION TO TACKLE GRAFFITI IN OUR COMMUNITIES

Lynn Tierney, local election candidate and Chairperson of the Saggart Village Residents Association, has expressed deep concern

over the ongoing issue of graffiti that has plagued villages in South County Dublin for a full year since a widespread targeting of the

areas in January 2023. The graffiti which was sprayed on numerous light poles, supply boxes, walls, buildings and other structures throughout Saggart and neighbouring villages of Rathcoole and Newcastle, remains a persistent eyesore today into the New Year of 2024, despite multiple reports made to South Dublin County Council (SDCC) throughout the year.

Tierney "| Ms states, have reported the matter directly to SDCC and local councillors. prompting some removal efforts by the council. I am also aware this is an ongoing request by residents, Tidytowns and other community groups throughout the county. However, a significant portion of the graffiti still affects the community's landscape, particularly on properties covered by memorandums of understanding with SDCC for removal, including the ESB."

Despite having also directly communicated with the ESB

and receiving confirmation from ESB that they do own some of the affected poles, Tierney notes that, Ms months later, the removal process has yet to be initiated from ESB property or that of other suppliers. "This delay not only affects the visual appeal of the villages but also reflects a failure in the collaborative efforts between local authorities and external entities responsible for property maintenance in the public realm."

"I am calling for a renewed commitment from all relevant stakeholders, including SDCC and ESB, to promptly address and eradicate the graffiti blight that continues to impact the villages of Saggart, Rathcoole, Newcastle and the wider Dublin area."


In highlighting this issue, Ms Tierney also urges residents to continue to take an active role in reporting instances of graffiti directly to South Dublin County Council by emailing info@sdublincoco. ie. Additionally, Gardaí recommend reporting active cases of graffiti taking place in the moment, noting that if a person is caught targeting an area, they can be linked to their graffiti tags in other areas.

"By continuing to focus on this issue and calling for stronger stakeholder responses while involving the community in the reporting process, I hope to expedite the removal of graffiti and enhance the overall cleanliness and aesthetic appeal of the villages."

Rathcoole Educate Together National School has welcomed the news the Department of Education has finally published details of the design for their permanent school campus in Rathcoole Village. The Department have now submitted a planning application to the county council for a 20-classroom primary school in Rathcoole Village. The school board and parents' representatives has called for all local councillors and TDs to give their full support to the school and ensure there are no further delays to this school building project.

Austin O'Sullivan. Chair of the Rathcoole ETNS Board of Management said "Rathcoole ETNS has been since September open 2020. We have 100 pupils and as a new school we are continuing to grow year on year. Our present temporary accommodation will be unable to accommodate the school from autumn 2025 and hence the urgency of our need to relocate the school to the permanent site in Rathcoole Village. Rathcoole ETNS uniquely among local

classes, which are the only classes that cater for autistic primary school children in Rathcoole Village. The new school campus will allow us to increase this to 4 autism classes. The planning application by the Department of Education is not a moment too soon. The Board of Management look forward to working with all stakeholders to provide this much needed school for the children of Rathcoole".

Mariana Rovenco, parent of a second-class pupil said "Our children are already playing an active role in Rathcoole Village life with our litter picking, biodiversity and sustainability projects. The permanent school campus is ideally located adjacent to the Rathcoole Woodlands. Recently we held our Halloween Treasure Hunt in Rathcoole Park and Woodlands to bring awareness to the children of the natural beauty of the area.

In fact, the children are at present caring for the trees, soil and plant pots donated by Rathcoole Tidy Towns and the school has completed

We have been teaching Rathcoole children the 'thinking importance of globally and acting locally' with our biodiversity and tidy towns projects. The need for our pupils to commute from Rathcoole to Citywest every morning flies in the face of this. SOUTH DUBLIN COUNTY COUNCIL PUBLISHES 2023 GENDER PAY GAP REPORT

South Dublin County Council has recently published its second Gender Pay Gap Report, highlighting the percentage difference between what men and women are paid on average the organisation, in irrespective of roles or levels. The 203 report reveals a negative Gender Pav Gap of -9.92%, showing that the average earnings of all females in South Dublin County Council is 9.92% higher than the average earnings of all males in the organisation.

Employers with more than 250 employees in Ireland are required to publish their gender pay gap data before the end of 2023 and within six months of their reference date. South Dublin County Council and all local authorities in the country chose 30th June 2023 as the reference date.

Commenting following the publication of the report,

Colm Ward, the Chief Executive said "Publishing our gender pay gap data helps to reinforce our focus on supporting an open and inclusive workplace at South Dublin County Council.

It is evidence of an organisation where all employees have the same opportunities for recognition, career development and are treated fairly and equitably at work. We continue to be committed to addressing workplace barriers to equality and creating an open and inclusive workforce because of the clear benefits this brings to an organisation in terms of innovation and engagement in work."

AVERAGE HOUSE PRICES TO RISE BY 3PC IN 2024

Three-bed semi prices will rise by 3pc in 2024, estate agents nationally are predicting. A record shortage of supply has driven a 1.5pc rise in the last three months in the capital, but only in houses under a certain price, the Q4 REA Average House Price Index found.

House prices in Dublin and the other cities outpaced Ireland's large towns and counties commuter as

mortgage approved buyers country rose by 1pc in the chase properties within their price ceiling. The REA Average House Price Index concentrates on the actual sale price of Ireland's typical stock home, the three-bed semi, giving an accurate picture of the second-hand property market in towns and cities countrywide.

The actual selling price of a three-bed, semidetached house across the

final quarter of 2023 to €304,259 - representing an annual increase of 4.3pc. Time taken to reach sale agreed nationally is steady at five weeks as low supply continues to drive sales in an increasing interest rate environment.

Prices in Dublin city rose by 1.5pc in the last three months, meaning that the average three-bed semi in the capital is now selling at



€511.667 - an increase of 3pc in the last year.

"Dublin is becoming a twotier market, with the average house price proving to be an affordability ceiling," said REA spokesperson, Barry McDonald. "While our agents predict an average 1% increase across 2024, this varies according to prices in their immediate area. "Agents on the west side of Dublin recorded notable increases in Q4, with Lucan prices rising by €20,000 to \notin 435,000 (4.8pc) and Tallaght increasing by 3.5pc to €290,000. "In areas such as Rathcoole (€335,000, 1.4%) the market is chasing affordability, and a scarce supply of properties has been selling at a faster pace.

while "However, these agents are predicting rises of 3-5pc in 2024, areas where prices are above the average Dublin price showed little to no growth in Q4 and are forecasting price falls in the next 12 months"

CUSTOMERS DENIED ENERGY CREDITS FOR LOW USAGE

Sarah Holland, Sinn Féin candidate for Firhouse-Bohernabreena, has highlighted that some people aren't receiving energy credits due to "low usage". Vulnerable people have been rationing use in order to avoid huge bills, but have then been denied access to the Government emergency benefit scheme.

Ms Holland has called on consumers to appeal this directly with their suppliers, saying "Some people are staying cold as long as they can stand it in order to avoid huge bills. The last thing we want to see is people missing out on these energy credits because they have tried to ration use."

The Government energy credits were announced in Budget 2024, with the

payments supposed to have been credited to accounts from December onwards. However, some won't receive these credits until the New Year, and some won't receive them at all due to low usage.

Ms Holland has urged consumers to check their bills, get in touch with their suppliers if they have been denied the credits and complain to the Commission for Utilities Regulation if they have no joy with suppliers.

Ms Holland said "Suppliers have a responsibility to think twice before denying the credits for low usage. They should be aware that vulnerable, low income consumers could be trying to ration their energy use by staying cold and not

using appliances. "Shopping centres and community centres are full of people, particularly the elderly, trying to stay warm and avoid using their electricity at home. "Those people should be protected and supported where possible, and the credits added to their accounts."

BASKETBALL IRELAND REVEAL PLANS FOR €35M REDEVELOPMENT OF NATIONAL BASKETBALL ARENA

Basketball Ireland has plans for a announced €35m redevelopment of the National Basketball Arena, with planning permission submitted on the 19th of December. It would see the new multi-sport and multiuse arena double its capacity to 3,300. The proposed works would get underway in the summer of 2025 and are expected to take 18 months, completed in time for the start of the 2026/27 season.

The 8000 square metre facility will have space for four basketball courts, it will be a fully accessible and participants. It will also house a gym and café, along with corporate facilities and office space for Basketball Ireland staff. The project has the support of Badminton Ireland, Irish Squash and Volleyball Ireland, who have all expressed an interest in using the new state-of-theart amenity.

Basketball Ireland CEO, John Feehan, said: "The new Arena will provide a best-inclass indoor sports facility, which will cater for multiple sports, along with it being a premium indoor event space.

inclusive facility for all sports "It will be the home of Irish basketball and illustrates the passion and drive within the organisation to continue the growth of the game. Sport plays such a vital role in Irish society and this will be a wonderful resource, not just for the local community, but for the country as a whole.'

> Funding to build the new National Basketball Arena would be sought through government support, via the Large Scale Sport Infrastructure Fund (LSSIF), with applications due to open early in 2024. Basketball Ireland will also look to raise

funds via a naming rights partner for the new Arena, along with a philanthropic general programme, fundraising, commercial sources and prudent lending, where required.

Basketball Ireland chairperson, Professor Seamas Donnelly, added: "The current National Basketball Arena was built in 1993 and while it has served us well, it's in need of an upgrade to future-proof the venue and help continue the progress of the sport. The National Basketball Arena caters for every level of basketball - from schools, colleges, wheelchair, Masters and Socia-Ball, to elite level of our National League and National Cup, along with being the venue Irish international for teams competing in FIBA EuroBasket and FIBA World Cup qualifiers. "This new multi-sport Arena will be a huge asset to the Irish sporting landscape in Ireland and it's wonderful to have the support of other indoor sports - Badminton Ireland, Irish Squash and Volleyball Ireland - for the project."

Environmental considerations have also been factored in, with 55 EV charge points and solar panels to ensure the building will be constructed to the highest energy efficient standards. The new Arena will have an air to water heating system for heating and PV electric generation. There will be rainwater collection and reuse, a green roof for sustainable drainage and augmentation of wildlife habitat, while much of the landscaping would feature wildflowers. native In addition, extensive bicycle storage will be available for those traveling to the Arena.

designed by NBK Architects, one of the architects, Mark Whelan, explained its design. and Balgaddy, but says that he regularly takes calls from outside his own constituency too. He says that both he and his party colleagues continue to take calls from worrying numbers of people, simply feeling abandoned, 'fobbed off' and left with little or no immediate support, or actual solutions to offer them.

Cllr Ó Brádaigh said "The despair by so many people coming to me is upsetting. I really do worry about the impact upon so many people's own mental wellbeing. In some cases, I have Palmerstown had people crying on the

telephone and I often feel a sense of hopelessness personally, at not being able to offer the answer they so desperately want to hear.

"I looked at the numbers recently on the South County Council Dublin housing list. It now stands at 6,173 households at the end of November. This is an additional 285 more since I last asked the same question in May. All the while, the so called affordable housing scheme in our jurisdiction is simply just not that, with the vast majority of people unable to meet the criteria.

Ó Brádaigh also said "Alongside the housing waiting list numbers, we witnessing increased are numbers forced to register homeless with the as Council and seek emergency accommodation. There are now 1,452 people on this list. This does not include so many others that are not presenting, sleeping rough and 'sofa surfing'. The figures I believe are actually much higher. Of this number, 653 are children and 799 adults. As a percentage, the number of children has increased from 43% to 45%. I simply don't believe that there is sufficient political

will. determination, or ambition by those charged with tackling both the immediate and long-term housing need of our people.

We need a radical and fundamental approach to housing delivery, and we need it now. In other words, we need change!"

and bustle outside while remaining fully engaged with their studies - an important requirement. The freestanding quiet unit features individual pods for complete isolation, a study space, and comfortable beanbags. paid particular Codex attention to the materials, incorporating fabrics are soft to the touch with no rough or harsh materials and no sharp edges that could cause distress. Acoustically, the unit offers top-tier sound



control, ensuring users are disconnected from external noise.

The colour palette, featuring gentle, muted tones of blue, grey, and white, aims to soothe, while charging points eliminate 'range anxiety.' Importantly, students can access the unit without prior booking, providing additional reassurance of a safe space.

"Thanks to our partners Codex, we are delighted to open this essential space for our students," said Fiona Earley, DCU's Autism Friendly University Coordinator. "It's vital that we can provide a quiet space where anyone who is struggling or feeling overwhelmed can feel safe and secure while remaining engaged with their studies. It's a welcome addition to campus and we're very grateful to Codex for the design and direction they have provided."

In addition to delivering DCU's new quiet space, Codex has been a sponsor of the university's 'Access to the Workplace' programme since its launch in 2019. This provides gifted students socio-economically from disadvantaged backgrounds with the opportunity to pursue a third-level education that might not otherwise be attainable for them.

HOLY FAMILY COMMUNITY SCHOOL STUDENTS GRADUATE FROM STEM PASSPORT FOR INCLUSION INITIAT

Students from Holy Family Community School in Rathcoole were among those to recently graduate from the STEM Passport Inclusion for Programme. experiencing a notable boost in confidence and a heightened intent to pursue STEM education at third level.

STEM Passport for Inclusion was launched two years ago with an ambition to address inequalities in accessing STEM careers among post-primary students in socially disadvantaged communities. programme's innovative The approach, which combines an educational qualification (Level NFQ), education supports, mentoring from industry and role models, provides a unique pathway for students to progress to third level education and achieve a STEM qualification.

Since the launch of the pilot programme two years ago, 1,250 students have participated leading to a significant increase in the students' confidence and intention to pursue STEM education at third level. In the wake of the recent graduation, Maynooth Microsoft University, Ireland. Science Foundation Ireland, and the Department of Education, announced the nationwide expansion of the STEM Passport for Inclusion initiative. This expansion aims to reach an additional 5,000 students, fostering greater engagement in STEM disciplines across the country.

The national expansion of the

programme was announced at the 2023 STEM Passport for Inclusion graduation, which took place at Maynooth University and will see the initiative engage a further 5,000 students. At the recent graduation three hundred female senior cycle students from 17 DEIS schools in Leinster received a certificate for participating in the newly developed Level 6 NFQ certificate in 21st Century STEM Skills.

Welcoming the announcement, Minister for Education, Norma Foley TD said "It is important that every student in our schools has equal access to develop the skills and knowledge for success. STEM Passport for Inclusion is an important initiative in broadening access to STEM and fostering a more diverse and Following inclusive culture. the success of the pilot, I am pleased with the expansion of the programme nationwide to support more students from socially disadvantaged communities to consider STEM within school and as they make their journey into the world of work. By working together across Government. industry, and the education sector, we can ensure that everyone, regardless of gender, background, or socioeconomic status, has the opportunity to thrive in our future economy.³

Speaking about the plans to extend STEM Passport for Inclusion, Dr Katriona O'Sullivan, Digital Skills Lecturer at Maynooth University said "We're delighted to announce

the expansion of the STEM Passport for Inclusion initiative. The impact to date has been far reaching and it was so nice to be able to make this announcement as we mark the graduation of this group of students from Maynooth University. Some of them will be the first in their family or school to get a university award and many will not have taken any science, technology, or engineering subjects in school. We are delighted for them.

"Since we launched the pilot programme two years ago, 1,250 students have engaged with the initiative, with a significant the students' increase in confidence and intention to study STEM in the future achieved. We are hugely excited to be able to roll the initiative out nationwide across academic years 2023 to 2025 - we currently have 2,000 students from DEIS schools registered in three Universities taking the module. Furthermore, the students will have the opportunity to benefit from mentoring from more than 600 mentors from 40 companies across Ireland.

"We have also just agreed in Maynooth to pilot a DEIS STEM pathway where students who participate on the programme in future years will become eligible to apply for 50 Leaving Cert points towards Engineering and Computer Science degrees in our university. This is real innovation in education; higher education working with each other and with post primary education, and industry, to create STEM pathways

for under-served girls."

Microsoft is the STEM Passport for Inclusion's lead industry partner. having contributed €600,000 in match funding to date. In addition, Microsoft's Dream Space education team codesigned the Level 6-accredited (NFQ) STEM Passport module and has supported the delivery of the STEM Passport curriculum to participating students in Dream Space venues in both Dublin and Belfast. More than 200 of Microsoft's employees are actively supporting the STEM Passport for Inclusion mentoring programme, alongside other educators and representatives from private and public sector organisations.

In partnership with Maynooth the Department University, of Education, and Microsoft Ireland and a number of industry partners, we're proud to expand the programme nationwide and support more students across the country who wish to build a career in the sector - an important step in preparing our society and economy with the skills that will be needed for the future."

The national roll-out of the STEM Passport for Inclusion programme (2023-2025), which is funded by Microsoft, Science Foundation Ireland, and the Department of Education, will see participants graduate from partner Universities - Atlantic Technological University, Munster Technological University and Maynooth University.
