Mark Ward TD has expressed concern at a spike in hospital appointment cancellations at Tallaght University Hospital in the first 9 months of 2023. There was over 6,500 cancellations in the first 3 quarters of 2023 compared to 5,200 in the same period in 2022, meaning 1,300 more cancellations.

Teachta Ward said that the Government's lack of a plan for overcrowding was impacting directly on waiting lists through cancellations. He said that the Government was shifting the problem from emergency departments to waiting lists, leaving patients waiting longer for access to care. The TD for Dublin Mid-West said that Sinn Féin has a

plan to reduce cancellations does not have a plan for by tackling overcrowding. He said the party would achieve this by investing in the necessary hospital bed capacity, in home care and step-down beds, in protected capacity for scheduled care, by fast-tracking elective centres, and investing in diagnostic capacity.

Teachta Ward said "The Government is failing to tackle hospital overcrowding which is leading to record levels of cancellations. There was over 6,500 hospital appointments cancelled at Tallaght University Hospital in the first 9 months of 2023. That is a 26% increase on the first 9 months of 2022. It is an extremely concerning spike. "The Government

hospital overcrowding, and this is forcing hospitals to rely on cancellations. This is shifting the problem from overcrowded emergency departments onto lengthy waiting lists. It is not a sustainable solution.

"Sinn Féin would invest in the necessary bed capacity so that patients can be admitted quickly and our professionals healthcare are working in safe environments. We need at least 2,400 hospital beds across the state over the next 5 years. "Sinn Féin would fast-track elective centres so that we can separate unscheduled, emergency from scheduled surgeries and procedures. This will increase surgical theatre capacity, help to reduce the number of cancellations, and free up capacity in hospitals for emergency care.

This Government has no plan to do that, and the longer it remains in office the worse the problems get."

EXTENDING CHILD BENEFIT FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS MARKS A POSITIVE STEP FORWARD

Plans to extend child benefit for those up to the age of 19 in full time education is a welcome development, a local TD has said. Deputy Emer Higgins said: "Following Budget 2024, one thing I was particularly keen to see is the extension of child benefit to all full-time students up to 19-yearsold. As parents know, child benefit stops once a child turns 18, but nowadays, many sixth-year students are 18 or even 19 when they're sitting their Leaving Cert.

"They're still in full-time education and at this stage in a young person's life, parents are still very much the financial providers for all their needs, and it isn't fair that child benefit stops at 18 when the majority of young people are still in secondary school. The expenses don't just stop at 18, especially when your teenager is still in school and not working. "This is something that I have raised in the past and as we look at ways to assist people to manage the cost of living, Government is now bringing forward this extension to child benefit," added Deputy Higgins.

"For a lot of hard-working families, child

benefit is the only social welfare payment that they receive and extending it up to the age of 19, providing the young person is still in full-time education, would no doubt be a help to parents and guardian. "Set to benefit families in respect of around 60,000 18-year-olds in secondary school up until their 19th birthday, this move recognises the evolving needs of families and the societal benefits of supporting education".



I believe the plan to convert the planned ground-floor retail /business spaces into additional apartments would contradict the County Development Plan 2022-2028. The Development to promote seeks

well designed streets and public spaces which is generally characterised by the presence of active frontages. The Main Street and the Slade Castle Development have been planned with business and retails space on the ground floor, the same should apply to this development as was originally granted.

While I welcome the 29 new homes that this development will add to the village, the addition of these extra four apartments will not outweigh the loss of potential retail and business space. I don't believe this change of use would be in the best interest of a

growing village like Saggart, the population of which has grown exponentially in the last 10 years and needs a thriving commercial element to support the growth. It is important to encourage new businesses which will in turn support existing businesses and bring vitality and employment to Saggart."

The approved plans for the former pub included, "refurbishment, alteration and extension of a 2 storey existing Public House building to accommodate 1 no. commercial office unit on ground floor and 1 no. 2 bed apartment on the first floor along".

Cllr O'Hara concluded "The Saggart Arms is an important part of the village streetscape and the redevelopment of and refurbishment of this building should proceed as originally approved"
