MINISTER MUST PUBLISH LEGAL ADVICE ON REGULATION OF CAMHS

Mark Ward TD, has said Minister Butler must publish legal advice on regulation of CAMHS. Deputy Ward was speaking after receiving a parliamentary question response from Minister Mary Butler in which she said she had received legal advice that she was not able to regulate CAMHS under the Mental Health Act, 2001. Teachta Ward said "The government have made it clear that mental health is not one of their top priorities. "They have already announced that the legislation to reform the Mental Health Act is still being drafted and will not be published until the summer session at the earliest.

"A delay in reforming the Mental Health Act 2001 has real consequences with a continued lack of regulation of CAMHS. "I introduced legislation to regulate CAMHS and give the Mental Health Commission the statutory powers to oversee the implementation of their recommendations, that they

made in following their review into CAMHS. Shamefully, the government kicked this legislation down the road. "I have since written to the Minister asking if she will give the necessary powers to the Commission under section 34 of the Mental Health Act. She has replied to say she has received legal advice that she cannot.

"Stakeholders have said that this is within her power under section 34 of the Act, so I have asked her to publish this legal advice. "This is disappointing for all of the mental health organisations that have been calling for this to be published as a matter of urgency, but it is also disappointing for the thousands of people who use our mental health services. "This Bill is an opportunity to put in place a robust, person-centric mental health legislation that will protect the rights of people with mental health difficulties in the decades ahead. "The Bill was

prioritised for drafting in the Autumn session and the government have once again put it on the long finger. The government are not treating this with the urgency that it deserves. "With the possibility that a general election could be called at any point, the delay in the publication of the Bill may mean that it may not be completed in the lifetime of this Government. "We have had review after review into CAMHS, but no urgency from Government to prioritise this legislation. This delay is letting our young people down once again.

"Pre-legislative scrutiny for the update of Mental Health Act 2001 was carried out on in October of 2022. The fact that we are over a year on and it is still not on the priority publication list shows to me that it is not a priority for Government. "The longer this is delayed, the longer that service users and frontline mental health organisations have to wait."

ROBUST POLICING PLANS ARE ESSENTIAL FOR EUROPA LEAGUE FINAL TO PREVENT CHAOS

Barry Andrews, Fianna Fáil MEP for Dublin, is calling for comprehensive policing arrangements ahead of the UEFA Europa League final scheduled for May 22nd in Dublin. This call to action arises amidst expressed concerns from UEFA General Secretary Theodore Theodoridis, who highlighted the potential challenges surrounding the Europa League final.

With the match set for the Aviva Stadium and the possibility of Croke Park, with its 82,000-person capacity, being designated as a fan zone by European football's governing body, there are concerns regarding the capacity to accommodate the influx of fans into the city.

Andrews emphasised the necessity of robust policing strategies, stating, "Given the significant fan bases of the teams vying for the final, it is essential that adequate measures are in place to ensure safety and security. With the eyes of the footballing world set on Dublin, it is crucial to avoid incidents akin to the unfortunate events involving Liverpool fans in Paris during the 2022 Champions League final."

Reflecting on past incidents, particularly the Europa League final in Seville in 2022, Andrews stressed the importance of proactive measures to prevent clashes between supporters, citing previous confrontations between Rangers and Frankfurt fans. He remarked, "We must take proactive steps to prevent Dublin from descending into chaos. We cannot afford a repeat of the scenes witnessed in Seville, where violence marred the event."

"While the economic benefits this game will have on Dublin will be immense, I cannot help but recall footage of fans clashing in the streets while locals ran for cover in the 2022 final. This cannot be the case in Dublin in May."

Andrews underscored the heightened significance of crowd control measures, noting the unprecedented convergence of fans in Dublin, with both the Aviva Stadium and potentially Croke Park set to be at capacity. He expressed concern that, should teams like Rangers and Liverpool advance to the final, the overflow of supporters onto the streets and into bars could pose significant challenges.

In conclusion, Andrews, a lifelong West Ham supporter confessed, "While I would love to see my childhood team, West Ham, in the final, the presence of Liverpool would undoubtedly enervate the city, given their passionate Irish following."

11 NEW DATA CENTRES WERE GIVEN PLANNING PERMISSION IN SOUTH DUBLIN DESPITE COUNCILLORS VOTING TO BAN NEW DATA CENTRES UNTIL 2028

In March 2022 People Before Profit Cllr Madeleine Johansson proposed and passed a motion on South Dublin County Council to ban any new data centres for the duration of the new County Development Plan 2022-2028. However, this democratic decision was overturned by then Minister of State at the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage, Peter Burke in summer 2022.

Ireland, and South Dublin in particular, has become the biggest hub of data centres in Europe. There are at least 37 already in operation in South

Dublin alone. Data centres accounted for almost a fifth of all electricity used in Ireland in 2022, as much as was used by all households in the country's urban areas.

Cllr Madeleine Johansson said "The government's insistence on increasing the amount of data centres is not compatible with achieving our climate targets. Data centres are using enormous amounts of electricity and water, when there is already a strain on the grid and water supplies." "11 new data centres have been given planning permission, that wouldn't have happened

if my motion hadn't been undemocratically overturned by the government. Some data centres have been refused permission based on the stricter rules in the plan thanks to my motion. I will continue to fight for a moratorium on Data centres in South Dublin."

Gino Kenny TD added "People are playing their part, we can see that because household

electricity usage has gone down but meanwhile, the government insists on increasing the number of Data centres. This is clearly at odds with Ireland's climate targets and will make it next to impossible to achieve our climate goals.

People Before Profit will continue to campaign for a moratorium on Data centres in South Dublin and nationally."

SECONDARY SCHOOL ENROLMENT CRISIS SET TO CONTINUE

TDs Eoin Ó Broin and Mark Ward have called on government to address the delays in school capital projects in Dublin Mid-West immediately. An unpublished school capacity survey found that three out of four parents are unable to secure spots at oversubscribed secondary schools.

Teachta Ó Broin said "Shortages of school places

in this area are a result of poor planning and delays in providing school buildings by government. "They are also a direct failure of a broken modelling system, that focuses on capacity in existing schools, while failing to take demographic changes or decades of long under-resourcing of schools into account. "Students are being forced to travel far and wide to find an available

school. "Some are being left with no other option but to get home tutoring as a result of enrolment pressure.

"Many parents and their children, who in some cases live within metres of their school, are not able to secure a school place for the next school year. "It is placing avoidable stress and pressure on families. "Families and students in Dublin Mid-West

deserve better. Teachta Ward said "Oversubscription of schools naturally equates to increased class sizes and we all know the detrimental impacts large class sizes can have on a child's education, particularly those with special educational needs. "They create barriers to effective learning and hinder students' academic and personal development. "Sinn Féin believe that smaller class sizes in Dublin Mid-West are vital as they can facilitate greater student participation and engagement.

"Smaller class size will help increase individual attention and make it harder for students, particularly those with SEN to get left behind, this in turn will lead to enhanced academic performance. "We also need to see the urgent delivery of school building projects in Dublin Mid-West. "This will benefit students in Lucan Community College, Divine Mercy, Griffeen Community School, Scoil Áine, Holy Family Community School, Coláiste Pobail Fóla, Gaelscoil Cluan Dolcán, Gaelscoil na Camóige, St. Thomas, Adamstown Castle Educate Together National School and Scoil Mochua. "Government must address this crisis immediately. Every child should have a school place come September."

120,000KG OF LITTER AND RUBBISH ILLEGALLY DUMPED IN THE BEAUTIFUL WICKLOW DUBLIN UPLANDS

The environmental project, Pure (Protecting Uplands & Rural Environments) has recorded a 70% decrease in illegal dumping in the Wicklow/Dublin since 2008. Pure removed over 830 individual sites in 2023, with the collection of over 120,000kg (120 tonnes) of illegally dumped waste from the remote, beautiful, and scenic, Wicklow/Dublin Uplands. The initiative has made huge progress in reducing illegal dumping in the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands. If you compare the amount of dumping collected by Pure in 2023, which was 120 tonnes of waste, to 2008 which was the projects busiest year, when they removed 440 tonnes, the initiative has seen a 72% reduction in illegal dumping in Wicklow/Dublin Uplands.

Minister of State at the Environment, Climate and Communications, Ossian Smyth TD, said: "I think all of us who get to enjoy the Wicklow/Dublin uplands every year owe a debt of gratitude to all the local volunteers, both young and not so young, who take part in Pure Project and the Pure Mile for their continuing efforts to fight the scourge of illegal dumping in their local areas. I am delighted to confirm that my Department have recently committed to funding this important work

for another 3-year period until 2026'.

The Pure Truck is on the road every day, and since Pure was established in 2006, it has removed over 3,950,000kg (3,950 tonnes) of rubbish from over 14,800 illegal dumping sites in the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands, with the project processing over 15,900 reports/complaints. If you were to put all the rubbish that Pure has removed from the uplands into standard household rubbish bags, they would fill over 790,000 bags. If you lined up all these bags on the road, they would stretch all the way from Dublin Airport to Mizen Head in Cork, and back again.

Ian Davis, Pure Manager, commented 'The Pure partnership approach, incorporating statutory and non-statutory organisations, and members of the public, has proven extremely successful in combating illegal dumping in the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands and we are now recording an annual reduction. This reduction in dumping is a direct correlation with the increase of Pure Mile areas. The Pure Mile makes a huge difference to the environment, especially in areas that are affected by littering and illegal dumping. Pure Mile

volunteers have totally transformed the upland regions and because of their dedication, determination, and enthusiasm, they have not only reduced illegal dumping, but in some areas, eliminated the problem. A huge amount of progress has been made since Pure was established, however, there is absolutely no room for complacency, and it is vital that we continue to monitor the situation, or we will see a return to the old days, and dumping will increase.'

Pure has been recording and mapping every location and incident of illegal dumping in the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands since 2006 and they have built up a base-line-data of all illegal dumping activity in this region, the location of dumping, type of dumping, landowner, and approximate amount of dumping, and for several years now they have been recording an annual reduction. The data collected by Pure is valuable information providing indicators into the nature and extent of illegal dumping in Wicklow/Dublin Uplands, and statistical evidence for all illegal dumping incidents in this region.

Pure utilises a multi-disciplined approach in combating illegal dumping, incorporating a number of educational initiatives,

environment/community/heritage projects - The Pure Mile, public awareness campaigns, regional/national media campaigns, enforcement and preventative measures, GPS/GIS data-base to record all illegal dumping sites, and they also have a dedicated vehicle, the Pure Truck, which removes all illegal dumping from the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands. A new Pure Truck has just arrived with funding provided by the Department of Environment, Climate, and Communications, and Pure has recently confirmed that the department has agreed to continue to provide funding for Pure until the end of 2026.

Pure is a partnership approach, incorporating statutory, non-statutory organisations, and members of the public, and for the past seven years they have recorded an annual reduction in illegal dumping activity. This reduction in dumping coincides with the huge increase in Pure Mile groups, which is now numbering over 950 miles (1,529 Kilometres) of road, mountains, woodlands, valleys, forestries, upland amenities, car parks and pull-ins currently being adopted in Wicklow, South Dublin, Dun-Laoghaire, uplands. The Pure Mile is an

environmental, community, heritage initiative, that encourages communities and groups living in rural areas of Wicklow, South Dublin, and Dun-Laoghaire, to adopt a mile of road, or miles of road, in their local area, or in the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands and organise litter picks, clean-ups, anti-dumping campaigns, research information about their local wildflowers, plants, trees, animals, and the built, cultural, and social heritage of an area.

Thousands of Pure Mile volunteers, ranging from individuals to family groups, community groups, walking groups, hiking groups, running groups, cycling groups, schools, scouts, beavers, businesses, and organisations, removed hundreds of tonnes of illegally dumped waste and thousands of bags of litter and rubbish from the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands. Pure provide all groups with Pure Mile signage, Pure Mile high-vis vests, Pure Mile bags, gloves, litter pickers and they also remove all of the rubbish collected by the groups. In 2023, Pure Mile groups organised clean ups and litter picks of the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands which resulted in a visible decrease of litter and rubbish in upland areas. These clean-up events carried out by Pure Mile Groups

resulted in the removal of over 5,000 bags of litter and rubbish, and it further demonstrates the necessity and importance of The Pure Mile Project, and the need for continued collaboration and engagement to protect the Wicklow/Dublin upland environment.

With the introduction of the new deposit return scheme in early February this year, Pure anticipate that their Pure Mile Volunteers will see a reduction in the number of bottles and cans littered throughout the countryside.

Pure is the first initiative of its kind in Ireland incorporating statutory and non-statutory organisations and stakeholders, including, the Department of Environment, Climate, and Communications, Wicklow County Council, South Dublin County Council, Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council, Coillte, National Parks & Wildlife Service, and the Wicklow Uplands Council. This unique partnership initiative was established to combat illegal dumping in the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands and was officially launched in September 2006.

Pure are urging the public to report all incidents of illegal dumping in the Wicklow/Dublin Uplands to 1800 365 123 and Pure will remove it.

MOTORING LIFE WITH

NEW JEEP AVENGER REDEFINES EV MOBILITY

Having already been awarded such prestigious titles as European Car of the Year 2023 and Best Family SUV in the Women's World Car of the Year awards, the new Jeep Avenger is a pure-electric small SUV that is definitely worth getting excited about.

The new Avenger is the first Jeep to have been designed and engineered in Europe, manufactured in Europe, and sold exclusively in Europe, and it sets the theme for a host of new Jeep models coming our way in the years ahead. The Avenger is the first EV from the US firm, and it successfully manages to look compact and robust on the outside, and substantial on the inside.

Sets New Standards.

Designed with functionality in mind, the Jeep Avenger sets new standards for comfort and convenience in urban commuting or off-road adventures. Its innovative shock-resistant design protects the lights and skid plates from low-speed impact, with the vehicle completely shielded by the 360-degree bodywork protectors. The perfectly-proportioned muscular shapes that embody the exterior of the Avenger are enhanced by Jeep's trademark seven-slot front grille, while the full-LED headlights and distinctive rear lights make the Avenger a car recognisable at first glance. Traditional Jeep design cues work exception

lly well on the small SUV, and when you are seated in the stylish cabin, it is easy to forget that you are in a car that measures just 4.08-metres in length. The Avenger's standard 380-litre boot capacity can be expanded to 1,250-litres by dropping the rear seat backs.

Eco-Friendly Adventure.

The Avenger offers an eco-friendly powertrain that combines zero emissions with a sense of adventure and excitement. The Avenger is front-wheel drive only (for now, anyhow) and it uses a lithium-ion battery with a 51kWh usable capacity to produce 154hp and 260Nm of instant torque. As a result, it can sprint to 100km/h from a standing start in 9.0-seconds, and a fully-charged battery can provide up to 404km of range on a WLTP combined driving cycle, with up to 550km achievable on an urban cycle. The Avenger can charge at a rate of up to 100kW at a public fast charging station, and this can provide a 20-80% charge in just 24 minutes, or a 30km range boost in just 3 minutes if required. It can also be charged at a rate of up to 11kW via a domestic wallbox charger.

Trims & Specifications.

The new Avenger is offered in three trim guises: Longitude, Altitude and Summit, each adding progressively more standard equipment. Key standard equipment in entry-level Longitude trim includes a 7-inch TFT display, 10.25-inch DAB radio & infotainment system with 6 speakers, Apple CarPlay and Android Auto with wireless mirroring, front central armrest with storage, height adjustable cargo floor, 16-inch painted alloy wheels, LED reflector headlights, an All-Terrain mode selector, alarm, automatic air-conditioning, cruise control, EV drive mode selector, hill descent control, keyless start, rear parking sensors and Vulnerable Road User Recognition (AEB) - pedestrian & cyclist. Additional standard specification in Altitude trim includes a 10.25-inch colour TFT display, 17-inch alloy wheels, passive

entry, tunnel pad cover for centre console, adaptive cruise control, handsfree tailgate, traffic sign information, and a rear view camera with dynamic guide lines. Upgrading to range-topping Summit trim will bring with it heated front seats, front & rear velour floor mats, 18-inch diamond-cut alloy wheels, automatic high beam assist, bi-function LED projector headlamps, power-folding door mirrors with integrated puddle lamps, LED front fog lights, LED tail lights, rear privacy glass, 360-degree parking sensors, adaptive cruise control with lane centring & traffic jam assist, heated windscreen, urban blind spot monitoring, welcome & leaving lamps and wireless smartphone charging. No matter what trim level is chosen, the Avenger comes with All-Terrain drive modes that provide the driver with the choice of Snow, Mud or Sand modes to suit road and weather conditions, in addition to Eco, Normal and Sport drive modes too.

On The Road.

My test car was a Jeep Avenger Summit, which was finished in striking 'Sun' metallic paintwork with a Volcano (black) roof, and stylish 18" diamond-cut alloy wheels. The Avenger's short front and rear overhangs, wide track and significant 200mm of ground clearance give it a chunky look. The cabin feels roomy - even for adults over 6 feet tall - and overall build quality is excellent, while drivers will find the logical dash layout easy to use. Jeep claims there are 34 litres of storage in the cabin, with the space underneath the central screen particularly useful. The infotainment system is right up-to-date in terms of the technology used, the screen is a good size, and it is responsive too. The climate controls sit on a row of piano-

style buttons underneath the touchscreen, and this will come as good news for many drivers. On the road, the Avenger's dynamic ability really shines through, with the characteristically rigid structure and firm suspension keeping the car's body control in check, without compromising overall comfort in the process.

The Avenger is a really easy car to drive around town, where its light steering, compact size and relatively-high seating position prove invaluable. The punchy electric motor enables quick progress, and even though the regenerative braking system doesn't allow for one-pedal driving, it does slow the car sufficiently enough to allow for smooth and well-controlled braking. The push-button drive gear selector is located at the bottom of the central dash, and is easy to get used to. For drivers who do wish to take advantage of the regenerative braking function, all that is required is a double press of the 'D' button when required. In terms of efficiency, the Avenger is capable of consuming as little as 15.6kWh/100km on a WLTP mixed driving cycle, with annual road tax costing just €120.

The new Jeep Avenger is a really likeable and immensely capable small SUV that is cleverly packaged, efficient, and great to drive. The Avenger redefines what it means to be an electric vehicle by seamlessly blending power, versatility and cutting-edge technology into one exceptional package specifically tailored for every driver's needs. FUNDING SHORTFALL LEADS TO MENTAL HEALTH REDUNDANCIES AT JIGSAW

Mark Ward TD has called on the Government to reexamine its decision to reduce funding for Jigsaw. Deputy Ward was contacted directly with reports that Jigsaw has received almost €1 million less this year from the HSE which has already led to redundancies at the youth mental health organisation.

Teachta Ward said "The reports of a shortfall in funding for Jigsaw is extremely worrying. "Jigsaw plays a vital role in early intervention in youth mental health that can reduce the need of CAMHS. "Jigsaw are the only primary care youth mental health service provider in Ireland, for young people aged 12-25. "It has been reported to me that this year there will be a shortfall of almost €1 million in funding to Jigsaw from the HSE. "This has already led to redundancies in the organisation and will likely lead to more. "At present there are 33 active vacant posts in Jigsaw and my understanding is that because of the

shortfall in funding, Jigsaw will be unable to recruit for these positions.

"There is a crisis in youth mental health right through from primary care to the specialist services of CAMHS. "Early intervention is key to addressing mental health needs in young people. "We have seen the demand for CAMHS greatly increase since 2020, a reduction in staff for Jigsaw will only make this situation worse. "What is worrying about this is that the Jigsaw waiting list is finally coming down. At one stage these waiting times were up to 30 weeks, the most recent figures we have received have the highest waiting times is 15 weeks but lowest times at just 1-2 weeks. "Jigsaw operates across 15 different sites, often setting up in areas most in need of mental health support for young people. "I have contacted Minister Butler's office and asked her to reexamine this so that Jigsaw can continue to carry out the vital work that they do in our communities."

20 SCHOOLS ACROSS IRELAND COMPETE IN GRIFFITH COLLEGES ANNUAL SCHOOLS DEBATING COMPETITION

On March 22nd Griffith College held their annual Schools Debating Competition and saw 20 Schools from all over Ireland compete. Finalists on the day were CBS Kilkenny & Saint Brigid's Killarney who debated on the motion "This House believes that the age of majority should increase from 18 years of age to 21 years of age." 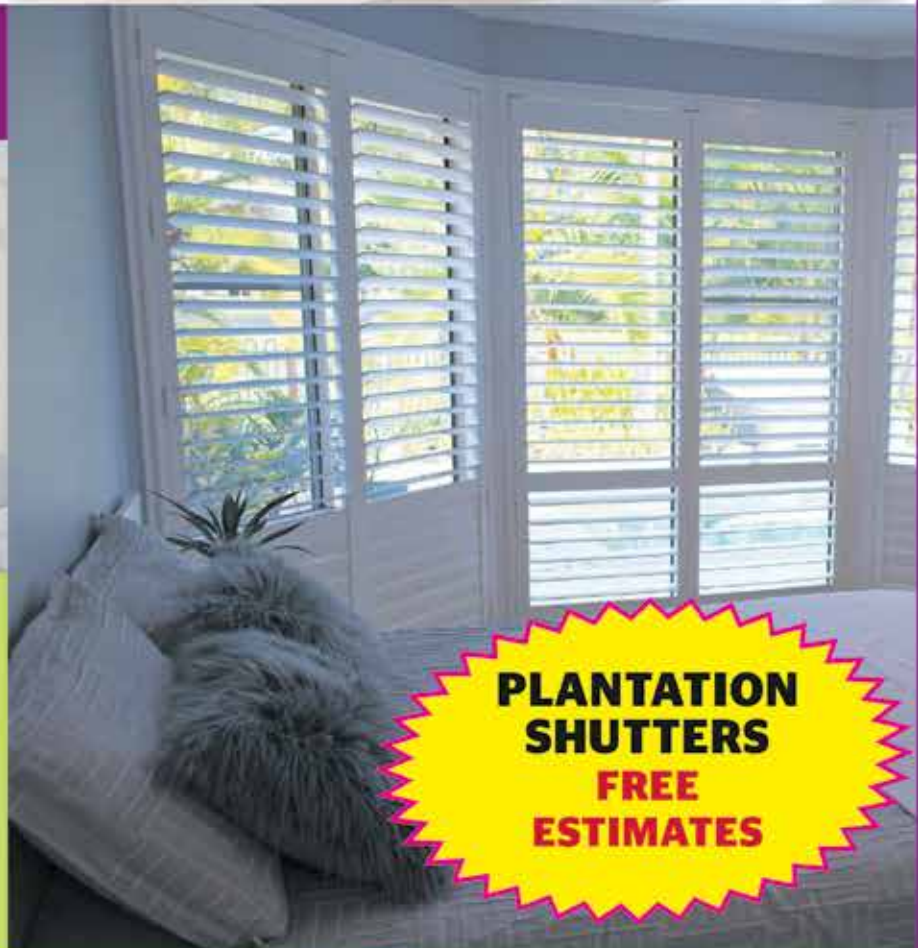
