### OVER EIGHT THOUSAND CANCELLATIONS SOUTH DUBLIN COUNTY PARTNERSHIP AT TALLAGHT UNIVERSITY **HOSPITAL IN 2023**

TD for Dublin South West Seán Crowe has revealed that there were 8.673 appointment cancellations at Tallaght University Hospital last year, an increase of 20% on 2022, according to new data released to Sinn Féin spokesperson on Health David Cullinane TD by the HSE.

"The Teachta Crowe said Government is failing to tackle hospital overcrowding which is leading to record levels of cancellations. There were 8,673 hospital appointments cancelled at Tallaght University Hospital in 2023. This represents an increase of 20% on 2022 and is an extremely concerning figure that represents real people missing out of vital appointments and hospital care.

"The 13 years under Health

and Donnelly have made the health service worse. They have decimated local health services and created a crisis in our hospitals. The Government does not have a plan for hospital overcrowding, and this is forcing hospitals to rely on cancellations. This is shifting the problem from overcrowded emergency departments onto lengthy waiting lists. It is not a sustainable solution.

"Sinn Féin has a plan for the health service to improve access, tackle hospital overcrowding, and reduce lengthy waiting lists. We would deliver 3,000 hospital and community beds to tackle overcrowding and inefficiency, end the recruitment embargo and train more health care professionals to

safely staff the health service, and invest in better local health services including GP care and a pharmacy-first model.

"We would fast-track elective centres so that we can separate unscheduled, emergency care from scheduled surgeries and procedures. This will increase surgical theatre help to reduce the number of cancellations, and free up capacity in hospitals for emergency care. "We would also invest in home support, community step-down beds, and diagnostic capacity so that patients can be discharged home or to a supported care setting when they are ready, and to ensure that patients' experiences are not delayed by lengthy waiting lists for



# **COST OF GRAFFITI REMOVAL ALMOST DOUBLES**

removing graffiti will almost double in 2024 according to councillor Derren Ó Brádaigh. The councillor is calling for tougher measures and penalties for those bent on mindlessly spray painting our public spaces. Cllr Ó

Brádaigh said "In 2023 South Dublin County Council spent €71,000 on graffiti removal and it is estimated that this cost will almost double this year. Most of it was removed from public buildings, parks and play areas, council managed shop car parks

and residential areas. As one example, when the new Airlie Park opened in Lucan, there was graffiti daubed all over the playground within the first 24 hours. More action needs to be taken and Gardaí need to be better resourced in terms of community policing.

Ó Brádaigh added "Like others, I am constantly submitting requests to the Council to remove newly emerging graffiti. The Council do their best and such is the problem that they must prioritise removing the 'most offensive' graffiti first. But perhaps we need to tackle the problem differently. The street art projects are just one way that could be expanded upon.

The Councillor said "In my time as a Councillor, I have called for community mural projects that I believe help to celebrate and recognise artistic young people and indeed the shared communities they live. Neutral community space is wanting in so many of communities. manv

including areas of large scale new development such as west Lucan, and it is these very forums that could offer outlets for youths to develop their ambitions in a way that actually rewards them and benefits the community.

Cllr Ó Brádaigh stated "A

provision of €131,500 has been made for the removal of graffiti in Budget 2024. The Public Realm section has for some years been working in partnership with the probation services to enhance the response to graffiti. The engagement with the probation services

"The National Transport Authority (NTA) invited proposals for a permanent outdoor sculptural artwork, funded through the Monastery Road Improvement Scheme. It is vital, that funding goes towards road safety, traffic movement, bus routes, and



so on. NTA must focus on addressing the ever growing traffic issues. The adjacent roundabout was upgraded at a cost of €300K and this was met with opposition and backlash from the residents. Questions need to be raised at how the NTA spends public

money, given the current cost of living crisis. Residents were not consulted or asked their thoughts. This money does not grow on trees... or sculptures. The green area has also been left in an awful state, post works." - Stated Cllr Trevor Gilligan PC.





# TD WELCOMES EXTENSION OF LONG COVID SCHEME FOR HEALTHCARE WORKERS

TD for Dublin South West Seán Crowe has welcomed the extension of the long Covid payment to healthcare workers and has called on the scheme to be extended to other frontline workers who contracted the virus through their workplace or occupation.

Teachta Crowe said "Long-COVID continues to be a serious health problem for hundreds, if not thousands, of healthcare and other frontline staff. It is a condition without precedent and needs to be responded with sympathy and greater understanding. "A great deal of research published over the last four years confirm it is a complex multi-organ condition that continues to impact negatively on people who previously showed no underlying symptoms.

"It is essential that we can develop an agreed and permanent solution for those affected. The temporary extension announced recently provides a bit of much needed breathing space for conciliation and will provide some peace of mind for affected health workers following months of uncertainty and worry. Government needs to follow this by including other workers including teachers, members of an Garda Siochána, firefighters, bus drivers, and others who contracted this virus through their work.

"Long Covid is debilitating and has left some with no quality of life. Some have been left bedridden, unable to even eat normally. Others have lung, heart or kidney conditions. It needs to be recognised by the government as an occupational condition with support including access to social protection and welfare schemes."



#### Spacious Cabin & Boot.

The Solterra's interior is presented in an ergonomic fashion, with the car's 2.85-metre wheelbase providing generous leg and headroom for the driver and up to four passengers. The cabin features a high-mounted digital gauge cluster, a large infotainment system touchscreen and an elevated centre console with an easy-to-operate rotary shift knob.

12.3-inch touchscreen is located in the centre of the dash and it features Apple CarPlay, Android Auto, and a wireless phone charging facility as standard. The Solterra's deep windscreen, large side glass and panoramic sunroof

(trim dependent) give the cabin a light and airy feel. Various storage areas dotted around the car will come in handy for family trips away, and the large bin under the centre console adds even greater practicality. The boot has a useful 452-litre capacity, and there is a storage compartment underneath the boot floor for the charging cables too.

#### Subaru Safety Sense.

The Solterra comes with a suite of advanced driver-assistance technology under the title of 'Subaru Safety Sense', and it includes such features as: Adaptive Cruise Control, Pre-Collision Emergency System. Steering Assist, Lane Departure Alert, Lane Centring Function, Blind-Spot Monitoring, Rear Cross Traffic Alert, Reverse Automatic Braking, Traffic Movement Notification, Pre-Collision Throttle Management (and Reverse Throttle Management), and Safe Exit Assist, which supports the safe exit from the vehicle on busy streets.

#### Impressive Specification.

Trim options consist of Limited AWD and Touring AWD versions, and buyers can choose from a palette of six fashionable colours. Entry-level Limited trim comes as standard with key features such as: 18" alloy wheels, Subaru Safety Sense, Apple CarPlay/Android Auto, fabric seats, panoramic view monitor, heat pump, heated front & rear seats, and keyless access & start. Additional features in Touring trim includes an upgrade to 20" alloy wheels, leather seats (synthetic), panoramic sunroof, wireless phone charging, Harmon/Kardon audio system with subwoofer, electric passenger seat, and an electric driver's seat with memory function. #### **Dual-Motor Powertrain.**

A dual-motor powertrain with 218PS (215bhp) and 336Nm of torque provides brisk acceleration, with the car capable of reaching 100km/h from a standstill in just 6.9-seconds, on its way to an electronically-limited top speed of 160km/h (where permitted). The power on offer can be deployed differently depending on the drive mode, of which there are: Eco, Normal, and Power, along with an X-mode which is intended to help in wet and slippery conditions, or on rough terrain, by independently regulating the power distributed to all four wheels when required. Drivers who do wish to take their Solterra off-road will benefit from 210mm of ground clearance, along with the fact that the Solterra can distribute 60 percent of its torque to the rear axle in order to achieve maximum grip with minimum fuss.

The Solterra's battery pack has a usable capacity of 71.4kWh, and this is enough to provide a range of up to 465km on a single charge. When plugged into a domestic wallbox (11kW) power outlet, the onboard charger can fully recharge the battery (0-100%) in approximately 9 hours. However, when connected to a public DC fast-charger, a 10-80% charge can be achieved in as little as 30 minutes.

#### Test Car Details.

The relatively-small steering wheel adds an element of sportiness to the driving experience, and the responsive steering helps to battery warranty as standard.

On a motorway, the car performs in a serene manner, and there is always lots of instant acceleration available for overtaking slower moving vehicles, with wind and tyre noise well insulated from the cabin. When travelling along a back road, the Solterra's agile chassis provides the car with enjoyable handling characteristics, with the reassuring grip from the all-wheel drive system adding confidence to every journey. Drivers can increase the amount of brake regeneration by using a button control, or steering wheel-mounted paddles to choose between four levels of deceleration.

#### Verdict, Pricing & Warranty.

The new Subaru Solterra EV successfully blends its excellent on-road driving dynamics with impressive off-road capability, and it also benefits from the low running costs associated with EVs. The Solterra Limited AWD and Touring AWD are priced at €51,495 and €56,495 respectively - inclusive of current EV subsidies for private buvers.


