GOVERNMENT MUST LISTEN TO FAMILIES KNOCKMITTEN OLYMPIC **AND REFORM CAMHS**

Mark Ward TD, has called for care when they have been appointment with CAMHS was the urgent need to regulate Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services, CAMHS. Deputy Ward was speaking following the report launch by Families for Reform of CAMHS recently, which highlighted the lack of services for children. Families for Reform of CAMHS are a group of 1200 families that was formed in May 2023.

Speaking recently Teachta Ward said "I have highlighted the need to reform youth mental health since I became the Sinn Féin spokesperson for mental health in 2020. "I have been contacted by hundreds of parents in my constituency and across the country who have either been denied services in CAMHS or who have not received the right accepted.

"Families for Reform of CAMHS are a group of more than 1200 members who have come together to highlight their stories. In just a year, they have presented in Leinster House, they have spoken before an Oireachtas Committee and today they launch a report of a survey from their members.

"I was happy to host Families for Reform of CAMHS in Leinster House in recent weeks where they gave a presentation on the main finding of the report. It was powerful, it was moving and it was necessary to bring about the changes needed in CAMHS. "One parent said: "We thought getting an

the beginning of getting help, how wrong we were." Another raised the issue of how dual diagnosis can affect the level of care: "Passed back and forth between services too autistic for one and too anxious for the other."

of families have reported that their children deteriorated while waiting to get onto CAMHS lists. The have reported that early intervention is not a reality. "40% of children went to A&E while on the CAMHS waiting lists. "69% went for private supports while on CAMHS waiting lists.

"The system is not working and if children with mental health issues there is a dual diagnosis of an intellectual disability

or autism, or if they have a specialist mental health need of ADHD, eating disorders or those with suicidal ideation, then the specialist service is not being delivered. "We need a reform of our youth mental health services where children can reach their full potential, and for families to be able to live their lives.

"I brought legislation to CAMHS regulate under the Mental Health Act to bring about the necessary changes put forward by the Mental Health Commission in their review of CAMHS. Government kicked this down the road promising their own legislation. "This has still not materialised and families have been left waiting and children have not been receiving adequate care.

LDA SEEKS APPLICATIONS FOR OVER 180 COST RENTAL APARTMENTS IN COOKSTOWN

The Land Development Agency (LDA) has announced the launch of 184 cost rental apartments in Cookstown in Tallaght. An online application portal for the new homes opened on June 20th. The high-quality development has

been delivered through the LDA's Project Tosaigh initiative and will provide eligible households with the opportunity to secure a new A-rated home at rents that are on average least 25% lower than comparable market rates as enabled

delivered through by the Government's STAR
DA's Project Tosaigh scheme.

The available homes are located at Cookstown Gateway and include a mix of studios, 1 and 2 -bed apartments. The development overlooks

Cookstown Luas Stop on the Red Luas Line and is within walking distance of Tallaght University Hospital and The Square Shopping Centre. A new grocery retailer is due to open in the complex shortly, which is also close to a host of local amenities, shops and services.The location is well-served by Dublin Bus. It's close to the M50 and near to a number of employment hubs including Citywest Business Campus and Grange Castle Business

The rents are set at €1,000 for a studio apartment and €1,225 for a 1-bed. Rents for a 2-bed apartment start at €1,425.

The homes at Cookstown Gateway were delivered in partnership with Stranwill Ltd. Would-be applicants are advised to familiarise themselves with the eligibility criteria and to prepare the documentation they will need if selected through the lottery

application process. Project Tosaigh is a Government initiative being delivered by the LDA in which the Agency steps in to facilitate the completion of housing projects and then makes the new homes available to renters on a cost rental basis or to purchasers at an affordable price.


Created under the Affordable Housing Act 2021, cost rental offers a longterm secure rental option at below comparable market rates for would-be tenants who do not qualify for social housing but who cannot access the private market without support. Applicants for cost rental homes must have a net household income of below €66,000 in Dublin and €59,000 outside Dublin.

The Cookstown Gateway announcement follows the recent launch of over 600 cost rental Project Tosaigh apartments at four separate developments in Dublin and Leixlip in Kildare. In total,

more than 900 cost rental homes have been delivered by the LDA in the past year, with almost 500 tenants now living in LDA homes across Dublin, Wicklow and Kildare. The average rent of an LDA cost rental home in Dublin now stands at €1,409 per month compared to the €2,098 in the private rental sector.

John Coleman. Chief Executive Officer of the LDA said "The LDA is delighted to bring much needed cost rental homes onto the market in Dublin. These are high quality, A-rated apartments in a great location at below market rents with security of tenure. It's a really excellent opportunity for people looking to live in a wellconnected and established community. "I would strongly urge potential applicants to familiarise themselves with the application process and the qualifying criteria to give themselves the best chance of securing one of these great homes."

Courthouse in Rathcoole was officially opened by Cllr Francis Timmins, deputising for the Mayor, on the 24th May, following the completion of major capital upgrade works South Dublin County Council, to conserve and protect the original Old Courthouse building and add a new extension to provide for additional community space.

The Old Courthouse, a

historically significant and conserved structure, located on the Main Steet of the Village has played a key role in the life of the local community since before the turn of the 1900s, performing a variety of roles throughout

the years. Originally a court of petty sessions up until 1924; the old courthouse became the site of a local library until the early 1970s and then a key community hall facility and home to a variety of local community

groups under the stewardship of the Rathcoole Community Council right up to the early 2000s.

Consultations with the local community around the future usage of the building commenced in 2018 and plans developed to both conserve and upgrade the fabric of original courthouse but also to build an extension to the rear of the building to accommodate an additional meeting room, additional toilets, a kitchen/café area and outdoor courtyard. Funding for the works was allocated from the Council's Capital Programme Budget and in addition funding was also secured to support the project from the Department of Rural and Community Development under their Town and Village Renewal Scheme.

Speaking at the official opening Cllr Timmons stated that 'The Old Courthouse upgrade project again provides another example of South Dublin County Council working hand in hand and in partnership with the local community, in a focused

effort, to conserve a ke historic community building and to achieve a significant positive community benefitting project'.

The Old Courthouse will be managed by a local management committee, made up of local community reps, reps from Rathcoole Community Council and members of the Council's local Community Department

Chairperson of the management committee Alan Fairman speaking at the official opening thanked the various local community volunteers involved in the many different aspects of the Old Courthouse project and thanked the Council for the huge support and work completed by many different council departments to make the project a huge success. Alan commented that the local management committee 'aims for the Old Courthouse to become vibrant Community Hub and a key venue to host a wide range of events in the fields of Arts, Culture, Literature, History and Heritage'.



OFFICIAL OPENING OF SAGGART SCHOOLHOUSE **COMMUNITY CENTRE**

The Saggart Schoolhouse Community Centre was officially opened by the Mayor, Councillor Alan Edge on Thursday 30th May, following the completion of major capital upgrade works, transforming the former old St Mary's National School into a multi-purpose community centre, to help provide for the social and recreational needs of the local community in the growing Saggart Village area.

The old St Mary's National a historically School, significant and much cherished local building, built in the 1940's, served as the village primary school up until 2014, when the new St Mary's National School was constructed and opened on the grounds behind the local Church.

Following a series of consultations with local residents and key stakeholders, the old St Mary's National School site was purchased by the Council in 2018, a local management voluntarv committee was formed, and plans commenced to develop the old school property into a multi-purpose community centre for the area. The schoolhouse building with the four former classrooms were

conserved and transformed into three multi-activity rooms and fourth designed to accommodate childcare provision, a new extension constructed to accommodate a multi-purpose hall, reception area, toilets, kitchen and community café

The delivery of the Saggart Schoolhouse Community Centre represents a capital investment in the region of €3 million, with funding allocated from the Council's Capital Programme Budget and funding of €500,000 secured to support the project from the Leader Programme administered by Rural Dublin Leader.

Speaking at the Official Opening the Mayor stated, 'that he was absolutely delighted to officiate at the Schoolhouse Official Opening, in what is a hugely special day for the village of Saggart.' The Mayor acknowledged both the passion and dedication of the local community reps and the commitment of South Dublin County Council, working together with local communities, to deliver key community facilities to assist in meeting local community needs and was again evidence of the

NEW KIA EV9 DESIGNED TO OPEN

NEW HORIZONS

The new Kia EV9 is a fullyelectric, 6 or 7-seat SUV that boasts near-Range Rover proportions and an impressive array of standard equipment. Although it is large and imposing, the EV9 has a creditable aerodynamic drag coefficient of just 0.28, thereby aiding energy efficiency and refinement at motorway speeds. The EV9 embodies the Korean marque's current 'Opposites United' design philosophy, which involves combining contrasting qualities and finding synergies between opposing concepts. Opposites United helps Kia to stand out from the crowd and heralds a new era as Kia adapts to the changing world we live in.

Powertrain & Trim Options.

The EV9 is available in two

electric powertrain variants and two trim variants. The entry-level version is generously-equipped 7-seater 'Earth' model (in rear-wheel-drive format only), which comes with key features such as: 19" alloy wheels, triple panoramic display, heated front and second row seats, ventilated driver and passenger seats, head-up display, 360-degree surround-view monitor, premium Meridian sound system, blind-spot collision avoidance with blind spot view monitors, wide projection LED headlamps with high beam assist, and Highway Driving Assist 3. The flagship GT-line model comes with all-wheel-drive (AWD) as standard, and it offers buyers a choice of 6 or 7 seats. Additional standard equipment includes exclusive GT-line styling, 21" alloy wheels, dual sunroofs, intelligent adaptive front headlights, and remote smart parking assist 2. The 6-seater version adds extra comfort for the secondrow occupants, and these two seats can be swivelled around to face the two rear seats when the vehicle is stationary. Both versions of the EV9

come with a 99.8kW battery featuring Kia's fourth-generation battery

technology. wheel drive Earth model has a 150kW motor which produces 200bhp and 350Nm of torque, and this drivetrain variation can accelerate 0-100km/h from 9.4-seconds. The all-wheel drive GT line is powered by twin 141kW electric motors which produce 378bhp and 700Nm of torque, and it can accelerate from 0-100km/h in a blistering 5.3-seconds. Not long ago that would be a figure only achieved by a sports car, but here we have a 2,600kg electric SUV managing it with ease. Just like its award-winning, big-selling EV6 sibling, the EV9 is underpinned by Kia's EV-specific Global Modular Platform (E-GMP), and it shares many powertrain components, along with its multi-link suspension system. The EV9 can accept 800V charging from a 350kW ultra-fast public charger, so drivers can add 240km of range in just 15 minutes, or achieve a 10%-80% charge in just 24 minutes. Additionally, a 10%-100% charge can be achieved in just over 9 hours via a domestic wallbox charger. The new highvoltage 99.8 kWh battery pack stores more energy, and allows for a long range of up to 563km, and its bi-directional charging function enables it to power electronic appliances, or even, in the future, your house.

Amazing Road Presence.

The exterior design of the EV9 is undeniably distinctive, with its strong road presence and rugged off-road look sure to turn heads on every journey. Inspired by nature and modernity, its futuristic and outstanding lines design features add to its unique character. At the front, the EV9 features the latest generation of Kia's Digital Tiger Face, and the distinctive, vertical headlamps are powered by LEDs that are characterised by a thin lens projection or small cube projection, depending on the model chosen. To the rear, a unique star map lamp graphic within

the signature LED taillights gives the EV9 an instantly recognisable look. Automatic flush door handles contribute to a modern, high-tech look, while active air flaps with 'Air Curtain' improve aerodynamic efficiency. To finish off the distinctive look, low-drag alloy wheels are fitted as standard.

Impressively Spacious.

With a length of over 5

metres, the EV9 is Kia's

most spacious passenger vehicle yet. In addition being impressively spacious for passengers, the EV9 also comes with a front trunk (often referred to as a 'frunk') that can accommodate the charging cables. As would be expected, the boot space is also a substantial size, and with all of the rear seats in place, there is still 333-litres of space available. With the two rearmost seats folded down, this increases to an even more practical 828-litres, while still providing accommodation for up to 5 occupants. However, fold down the back two rows of seats and you will be left with a flat floor, along with a van-rivalling 2,318-litres of space. The high-quality dash is dominated by a super-wide infotainment and instrument cluster that is neatly integrated into one display, and the centre console is equipped with a fast, wireless phone charger. Various ambient mood lights are applied inside the cabin, providing different functions such lighting as speed linkage and car camping mode. The EV9's touchscreen navigation system offers a wide range of features such as Bluetooth multi-connection standard, enabling occupants to connect two mobile devices at once, while Android Auto and Apple CarPlay functionality is also standard. With Google Fast Pair Service, it is even easier for Android users to connect their phone to the vehicle's infotainment system. As with other Kia models, EV9 owners can benefit from Kia Connect Live Services, which

include online navigation as 21" black alloy wheels. The well as real-time information traffic, parking availability and parking costs, locations and pricing for EV charging points, and much more besides. spacious passenger compartment comes with its own connectivity ports, storage bins, air vents and controls, all of which are neatly designed and cleverly located. The EV9 is equipped with a host of active driverassist and safety features for maximum convenience and safety on the road, and it is the first Kia model to feature Kia's Highway Driving Pilot (HDP), which offers Level 3 autonomous driving, where local regulations and driving conditions permit.

My 6-seat EV9 GT-line AWD test car cut quite a dash in its elegant Ocean Blue metallic paintwork with contrasting

EV9's relatively-high driving position and deep windows provide excellent visibility and, when it comes to parking, the all-round vision is enhanced by standard-fit parking sensors and cameras. The EV9's long wheelbase (3,100mm) and completely flat EV architecture provide generous space for all occupants, with lounge-style comfort in all three rows of seats. The column-mounted gear selector is also home to the power-on and power-off button, and it is very straight forward in its operation. Despite the weight and size of the EV9, it accelerates with terrific urgency, and it has the ability to overtake slower-moving traffic with unwavering confidence. It feels reassuringly solid at all times, irrespective of the road surface, and it can safely negotiate sharp corners without negatively affecting the sense of calm within the cabin. The steering is nicely weighted, and the cossetting suspension set-up handles road bumps effectively, while the EV9's strong natural braking performance can be adjusted via paddle-shift levers, and that means that you can choose to drive in one-pedal mode for maximum brake regeneration.

Verdict, Pricing & Warranty.

The amazing Kia EV9 is roomy, very well equipped, and is a real joy to drive. Its handling characteristics are impressive, and all occupants are treated to an outstanding combination of comfort and luxury. The EV9 Earth (7-seat) and GT-Line (6 or 7-seat) models are priced at €77,500 and €85,500 respectively (exdelivery). All Kia passenger cars are covered by a 7-year/150,000km vehicle warranty as standard.
