will receive increased funding this year to make the homes of older people and people with a disability more suitable to live in, a local Councillor has said. Councillor Shirley O'Hara said: "The Housing Adaptation Grant is so important as it assists with the necessary adaptations, repairs or improvement works to make accommodation more suitable to the needs of older and disabled people supporting them to live in their homes.

"80% of the grant comes from Exchequer funding through the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage. The remaining 20% in funding comes from the relevant local authority which administers the scheme. "I am delighted that South Dublin

total allocation of €4,529,269, which represents an almost 20% increase on last year's funding.

"Overall, grants of up to €30,000 are available to assist disabled people carry out necessary works to make a house more suitable for their needs. "This is in addition to grants of up to €8,000 which are there to assist older people to have necessary repairs or improvements carried out on their homes and grants of up to €6,000 are available for mobility aids.

"When combined with the local authority contribution, overall funding of over €93 million in 2024 will deliver some 13,000 grants nationwide for older people and disabled independently in their own homes.

Minister of State for Business, Employment and Retail and local TD, Emer Higgins said: "Fine Gael is working to deliver stronger safer communities and it is important we support people to live in their own homes for as long as they possibly can. 

62 YEAR OLD DISABLED FATHER TAKES HIS PROTEST TO DÁIL GATES

A 62 year old disabled protested outside father the Dáil recently as part of his campaign for suitable housing. Christopher Moran was awarded a medical priority transfer almost 6 years ago by South Dublin County Council. His 22 year old son Michael has Down Syndrome, autism and is a wheelchair user. He requires 24 hours care and suffers from respiratory chest problems. He has been permanent antibiotics everyday all his life and uses nebulizers two times daily. Michael's parents, both

father and his mother, have mould, and the windows are conditions are completely to transfer to lift him in and out of the bath.

Michael's parents also have lots of health problems, his mother has arthritis and a hole in her heart. Michael's dad Christopher suffers from COPD, diabetes, sleep apnea and an enlarged heart. Christopher has himself been in and out of hospital 6 times in last 5 years with COPD and had pneumonia 3 times over the years.

Theircurrentaccommodation is full of dampness and

drafty. Christopher is also disabled man who uses a 4 wheel stroller for walking. As well as having to lift his son in and out of the bath, he also find it hard to get in out of the bath. He even had a fall a couple of months ago while getting out of the bath fell and he had to get help from his neighbours to lift him up off the ground. They are in urgent need of accommodation with a wet room suitable to Michael's needs.

Christopher is also concerned about the impact of antisocial behaviour in the area on the family and their health. His son Michael is sensitive to noise and finds it difficult to sleep at night with the noise from outside.

Councillor Madeleine Johansson who has been assisting the family said: "I'm shocked that this family has been waiting almost 6 years for a medical priority transfer. Their living unacceptable and the suitable council should act urgently People





There is now great uncertainty in terms of the future of the nursing home and this is causing great stress. Passage Healthcare are absolving themselves of any responsibility in terms of the viability of the nursing homes and this led to the HSE now intervening. A solution needs to be found very urgently either by another party or the HSE directly themselves that secures the nursing home for the 73 residents and dedicated staff ".

for Business, Employment and Retail, Emer Higgins has confirmed that a new business support package has been announced by Fine Gael colleagues, Minister for Trade, Enterprise and Employment Peter Burke, Minister for Social Protection Heather Humphreys and Minister for Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science Patrick O'Donovan.

I have some personal experience how some of these people that are new to our shores have contributed very positively to their new communities."

The Charter follows a Fact vs Fiction info sheet which was delivered to 70,000 homes across the County, a joint initiative between the Mayor, South Dublin County Partnership, The Dublin Volunteer Centre and South Dublin County Council. The document aimed to counter some of the myths surrounding those seeking international protection.



COUNCILS MUST BE PROPERLY EMPOWERED TO BUILD AND MAINTAIN THEIR OWN HOUSING STOCK

TD for Dublin South West Seán Crowe has said that the diminishing of the ability of local authorities to build and maintain their social housing stock has led to their inability to retrofit or adapt social housing to their tenants' needs, leading to energy poverty and homes unfit to people's medical needs.

Speaking after the Dail Teachta debate recently, "Ending the Crowe said housing crisis is not just about building homes. It is about maintaining the homes we have to a high standard. "Too many social housing tenants are living in poorly maintained homes and that is affecting quality of life and in too many cases, contributing directly to energy poverty as too many social houses are pumping walls and roof, "On top of that, it is simply taking too long to bring vacant and derelict properties back into the system. Some local areas are littered with properties that would make perfectly good homes, but they lie idle, boarded up, sometimes for years.

"We should create a dedicated annual fund authorities to for local supplement their existing response maintenance budgets. But we should also try and undo the damage that Fine Gael caused ten years ago when Phil Hogan gutted the local authorities' ability to build and maintain a housing stock without relying on private sector contractors.

DELIVERY OF OVER 390 AFFORDABLE APARTMENTS IN ADAMSTOWN

The Land Development Agency (LDA) has announced the planned delivery of 392 apartments in partnership with Quintain Ireland at The Crossings, Adamstown. The scheme consists of 9 studios, 189 one-bedroom apartments, 185 bedroom apartments and 9 three-bedroom apartments across 3 blocks ranging in height from 5 to 9 storeys. The LDA apartments are under construction and are due to be fully completed by 2026. They will then be rented to eligible households on a cost rental basis by the Agency.

The LDA apartments form part of the third phase of The Crossings at Adamstown. Quintain launched The Crossings, an urban village and retail centre, in September 2023 and the new development serves as the central core of the Adamstown Strategic Development Zone. A social, community and retail hub, The Crossings will ultimately include 1,000 apartments and a wide range of shops and services. The development also features an urban park spread out over 2-acres with amenities including a 14-metre play train, soft play trails, biodiversity corridors, a large plaza space and outdoor seating.

The new apartments have been secured under the LDA's Project Tosaigh initiative, whereby the agency steps in to provide the financial commitment needed to kick-start stalled or unviable housing projects. The LDA then makes the new homes available to renters on a cost rental basis or to purchasers at an affordable cost. In this case, all the homes involved are going to be cost rental. This is a new tenure, which provides a secure, long term rental option at below market rates.

To be eligible for cost rental housing an individual or household must meet a number of criteria. Their net household income must be below €66,000 per annum for applicants for homes in Dublin or €59,000 per annum for those outside Dublin.

This is the first time that the LDA and Quintain have partnered together as part of Project Tosaigh. The development is being financed by AIB and the LDA will purchase the apartments on completion. The LDA is in the

process of delivering 8,000 homes through its Project Tosaigh initiative by 2028. These homes will be in addition to those delivered through the LDA's direct delivery channel. which involves new developments on stateowned or acquired land. To date, the Agency has already agreed terms for almost 3,000 homes through Project Tosaigh with over half of these already delivered and others under construction. The 392 cost rental units being built by Quintain in Adamstown form part of a larger 436-unit development with the remaining 44 apartments allocated for social housing.

All of the apartments will be A-rated and built to a high standard. The development is located in the heart of Adamstown near to schools, community amenities and shops including The Crossings Urban Retail Village, which features a Tesco and an Aldi store in addition to a number of other outlets.

John Coleman, Chief Executive of the LDA said "We are delighted to announce the purchase of 392 homes in Adamstown through our Project Tosaigh initiative. These apartments are being delivered in partnership with Quintain and once completed, will be made available to eligible households at rents that will be significantly below market rates. The LDA is continuing to deliver high quality homes in the right places, and Adamstown is a great location. It has great transport links, a thriving community and excellent amenities. These apartments will provide long-term, secure homes in a well-connected Dublin suburb."

Michael Hynes, Chief Executive of Quintain said "We are excited to partner with the LDA on this apartment development, which we are delivering with finance supplied by AIB. We believe this development will add greatly to the new village centre we have created at the heart of Adamstown. At Quintain, we seek to deliver new communities in addition to new homes and this is a vision we share with the LDA. Adamstown is well served by transport links, community facilities and new schools, so we are looking forward to completing the apartments for the LDA and welcoming yet more residents to this rapidly growing area.'

LACK OF PARK RANGERS IN TYMON PARK

Tymon Park, resulting in security concerns and huge overtime bills, according to reports from Park Rangers. People Before Profit candidate for Tallaght Central Jess Spear has been contacted by Park Rangers raising concerns about the issue, following her involvement in the successful campaign. to increase maintenance and monitoring at the Watergate Park. Now she is calling to hire more Park Rangers, for Tymon Park and other parks in Tallaght.

"I was shocked to hear that there are only two Park Rangers for Tymon Park, compared to six for Corkagh Park in Clondalkin. Those two rangers are run off their feet, trying to maintain what is the second biggest park in all of Dublin. I've also been informed that they lack the proper equipment, and have no vehicle capable of going off-road in the park, meaning that if there was an incident or security issue in the park it could take over 20 minutes for them to get there as they have to leave the park and travel via the main roads.

"With only two rangers for the whole park that means whenever someone is out sick or on leave, other council staff have to be drafted in to help out, building up large

There is a chronic lack of Park Rangers in overtime bills. With one of these now retiring, the Council has moved to hire two new Rangers, one is starting in June and one in July, but we need more. We need to hire a whole team of Park Rangers, not just for Tymon Park, but also to monitor and maintain our other parks. For instance, the staff informed me Watergate Park used to have two Park Rangers before they were cut six years ago.

> "These parks are a beautiful asset to our community, and the Park Rangers do a great job, but we need more to ensure it is properly maintained and a safe place for everyone. Over the last few years, I've been working with Paul Murphy TD and local communities to fight for proper investment into our parks, but we keep coming up against resistance from the Council. It seems the Council and many Councillors do not realise just how important these parks are to families and our communities, and the crucial role Park Rangers play in keeping them safe and secure.

"As a Councillor I will fight for investment in our parks, and work with communities and Council workers to fight for more Park Rangers.'



EXPECTED PASSING OF ASSISTED HUMAN REPRODUCTION BILL IN THE DÁIL IS A WELCOME RELIEF **FOR FAMILIES**

The passing of the Assisted Human Reproduction (AHR) Bill in the Dáil recently is a very welcome relief to the families waiting to apply for lifelong recognition of their parent child relationships, a Senator has said. The AHR Bill provides a regulatory framework for reproductive interventions in Ireland as well as transparency in donor assisted human reproduction. The Bill will move to the Seanad before the Summer recess.

Senator Mary Seery Kearney said: "Historically the Bill provides a regulatory framework for domestic and international surrogacy ensuring the rights and protections for surrogates, children and intending parents. "The Bill also crucially provides a means by which children born from past surrogacies can regularise their relationship with both of their parents. "To date there has only been legal recognition of the biological father as the life long legal parent, mothers and second fathers can only apply for guardianship and custody which expires on the child's 18th birthday. At that point those parents become legal strangers to their own children.

"Extraordinary work has been done to bring a complex mix of legal rights to this point and it is most welcome. There are some matters which can't be completed in time by the summer recess and they will be dealt with in a supplementary bill in September. "This bill will provide a pathway for parents to apply for their parental orders in circumstances where their relationship with the biological father is estranged and there is a danger that the parental order application process would be weaponised by that parent. The Minister is mindful of the needs of those parents and will acknowledge them today when addressing the house.

"I have campaigned for our surrogacy community families to have an equal recognition so this is a relief - now on to the Seanad and the bill being signed into law. Applications for parental orders, including my own, will hopefully commence this autumn," Senator Mary Seery Kearney concluded.
