"Without access to affordable residential care or care in the home, people are forced into a hospital system that cannot afford to accommodate them and is unsuited to their needs. The awful phrase 'bed blockers' is often used. Too many people are stuck in hospital beds when appropriate care can be delivered elsewhere.

"Hospital stays should be an option of last resort when people just need a little help to live a semblance of an independent should not be the only resort. Thousands of delayed discharges of elderly patients are creating bottlenecks in our hospitals each year because people have nowhere else to go. It creates a knock-on effect through the services, leading to cancelled appointments and surgeries because of a lack of beds. It represents an abandonment of our duty to our older and more vulnerable citizens that it is often beyond the ability of many families to afford home care.

"The Government must stop burying its head in the sand on this issue, and finally prioritise older people and those with disabilities to ensure they get the support they deserve rather than simply trying to privatise anything that stays still long enough, just as it did with nursing homes and dental care."

## TENANTS PAYING €30,000 OVER GUIDE PRICE **TO SECURE PROPERTIES**

Tenants whose landlords are selling up are routinely paying €30,000 over guide price in a race to secure properties in Dublin before their leases expire, the Q2 REA Average House Price Index has found.

The number of sales in the capital due to landlords leaving the market has risen six points to 25pc in the past three months, the Index revealed. As buying is cheaper than renting in most cases, it is now an option for many departing tenants who are finding it easier to

secure mortgages because of their repayment history.

However, they are paying an average of €30,000 more than asking price to secure properties before time runs out on their leases, according to REA agents. The REA Average House Price Index concentrates on the sale price of Ireland's typical stock home, the three-bed semi, giving an accurate picture of the second-hand property market in towns and cities countrywide.

The actual selling price of

a three-bed, semi-detached house across the country rose by 2.3pc in the past three months to €315,352.

Prices in Dublin city rose by 1.6pc in the last three months, meaning that the average three-bed semi in the capital is now selling at €525,500 - an increase of 5.1pc in the last year. Agents REA McGee in Tallaght and Rathfarnham report that properties are routinely exceeding their value by €30,000 in the band between €250,000 and €350,000. "Properties guiding €320,000 are routinely selling for €350,000 simply because the buyer is under time pressure due to a notice to quit," said Anthony McGee. "If they are forced into the market, they are maxing out their loan approval to secure somewhere to live within their timeframe."

A feature of the market is that many houses coming to the market are exspokesperson Seamus Carthy.

"While we are seeing a slight improvement in stock, a lot of what is coming on the market in the capital needs substantial refurbishment,"

upgrading, according to REA he said. "Those intending to purchase a doer-upper are subject to different lending rules and their bank may look for proof that there are sufficient funds in place to renovate. "There are huge issues sourcing people

to do extensive repairs where multiple people are required. "As a result of this, people looking to trade up are opting for smaller extension work in their existing properties where it is easier to source labour.'

# ANNOUNCING THE INSTALLATION OF THE AN CHLUAIN BY HOLGAR C. LÖNZE

South Dublin County Council is delighted to announce the Installation of the An Chluain by Artist Holgar C. Lönze, a major new artwork in bronze commissioned by South Dublin County Council under the Monastery Road Improvement Scheme and In Context 5 Public Art Programme, with support from South Dublin County Council's Public Realm Section.

This sculpture is designed to make the hidden archaeological heritage of Clondalkin visible, marking the important 8th century monastic settlement near the salmon-rich Camac River. The placename Clon or Cluain suggests a monastic enclosure, hermitage or sanctuary and Crónán Mac Bécáin, son of Lugaid, who died in 637, is the local saint associated with it.

He is mentioned in the 9th C. Karlsruhe Calendar, a manuscript compiled in Glendalough, where he was an associate of St. Kevin. Two 3.2m high gable sections resembling a medieval oratory, form a gateway that aligns with a 'door' element which is back-lit with the text of a medieval manuscript that mentions Crónán. The artwork forms a landmark visible from the road while being accessible to pedestrians via a newly created path through a raised area resembling a historic lucht. The sculpture is shaped by hand, in bronze sheet by Kerry-based sculptor Holger Lönze, using the ancient repoussé process of alternative heating and hammering, a sustainable, low-carbon approach to public sculpture with great significance for Irish archaeology.

The brown patina of the door element contrasts with the green/blue of the gables and textured surfaces resemble rippling water of the river. 'The artwork is a contemporary visual link to the important heritage of

the area and contributes to a strong and unique sense of place', says sculptor Holger Lönze.

Monastery Road Scheme Improvement involved the upgrading of pedestrian facilities on Monastery Road to improve general walking and cycling conditions along the route from Clondalkin Village to the Redcow Luas Station. These works included the provision of zebra crossings, raised table top ramps with raised pedestrian crossing on side roads at junctions, bus ramps, widening and renewal footpaths between Clondalkin Village Redcow Luas Station, traffic calming on Monastery Road, installation of signalized pedestrian crossings at SIAC and Ibis Roundabouts, installation of a staircase at the Redcow Luas Station end and landscaping all along the scheme.

An Chluain was commissioned by South Dublin County

Council's Land Use Planning and Transportation
Department with the support of the Arts Office and Public Realm Section, through the Monastery Road

Improvement Scheme and the In Context 5 Per Cent for Art Programme under funding arising from Watery Lane housing construction scheme. The commission

is funded by the National Transport Authority, South Dublin County Council and the Department of Housing Local Government and Heritage.

commission, Maskey etc and they all highlight the same problems that mental health services are failing to meet minimum regulatory standards in key areas like staffing, care planning, risk management and premises.

Health Mental Commission inspected 66 registered approved centres. There was a deterioration in overall levels of compliance levels with legal requirements, Overall, the compliance rate of 85% last year was a decrease on the 88.37% figure reported in 2022. "It is clear that governance and management has not kept pace with patient needs, expectations and rights. "Worryingly, 42 instances of sexual assault were reported last year in approved mental health facilities This is up from 12 instances in 2022.

"I'm calling for immediate Government action to be taking to safeguard some of our most vulnerable citizens. "The report also calls for meaningful investment for mental health. At present Ireland provides just over 5% of the overall health budget to mental health. The

World Health Organisation recommends a minimum of 10% "Unfortunately, we are seeing the fallout now of years of underinvestment by the Government in Mental Health

# VITAL 'REACH' FUNDING ALLOCATED TO DDLETB TO SUPPORT EDUCATIONALLY DISADVANTAGED LEARNERS

SOLAS, the state agency responsible Further for Education and **Training** (FET), has announced over €250,000 in funding to Dublin and Dún Laoghaire ETB (DDLETB), to support marginalised community access education programmes in local communities, through €5 million distributed in the national Reach Fund. Initiatives such as this enable learners to take the first small steps towards engaging with the opportunities that exist for them in further education, higher education, and employment.

Speaking on the allocation of Reach Funding across Ireland Minister Patrick O'Donovan (TD said: "The impact of Reach Funding over the past four years is evident. Originally introduced in 2020 to support the most disadvantaged learners throughout the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, it now provides important funds to assist Dublin and Dún Laoghaire ETB, and community education providers to increase their capacity and ensure that they can support the participation of disadvantaged learners within their communities."

Siobhán Lynch Director of Further Education & Training for DDLETB said: "We are delighted to receive over €250,000 in funding to support community education providers Dublin and Dún Laoghaire. This vital funding will go a long way to support some of the hardest-to-reach people in our local communities. A key focus for the use of the funding is to help build digital infrastructure in our local region and the use

Mark Ward TD has called the progress on the Mental Health Commission's CAMHS as scant by the HSE and Department of Health. Deputy Ward was speaking after receiving a PQ response

with progress report on the 49 recommendations that were made by the Mental Health Commission months ago.

Teachta Ward said "It is 12 months now since the Mental Health Commission published their recommendations. Recently, I received a progress report on these. "Only 10 of these recommendations have been completed with others briefly addressed. "The first two recommendations, for CAMHS to be regulated under the Mental Health Act 2001. and for the Commission to monitor and do a year report on these recommendations, have not being started.

"I brought legislation to the Dáil in February of this year that would implement both of these recommendations. The Government shamefully kicked this down the road in favour of their own Bill which has not materialised. There is no urgency by Government to fix the crisis in youth mental health. "Another recommendation is to increase the CAMHS

budget which has little new investment by the Minister for Health. "The HSE, this week, have said that CAMHS staff will need to double to deliver the timely interventions that are needed, while the Government are determined to keep the HSE recruitment embargo in place.

"The recommendations made by the Mental Health Commission were brought children about because were being misdiagnosed, over medicated, falling off that cliff edge at 18. We also have children with a dual diagnosis of autism and mental health, falling through the cracks. "CAMHS needs to be a safe place for children to get help, and the vast majority of staff are working to their best of their ability.

"It was, however, worrying that this week a child psychiatrist pleaded guilty to sexually abusing a child under the care of CAMHS. This comes just after the Mental Health Commission's annual report where it stated 42 people reported sexual assaults whilst in mental health facilities. The Government are failing

to provide the appropriate care in our mental health services and this cannot be allowed to continue.



# INNOVATIVE TRAINING AND EDUCATION PROGRAMME LAUNCHED

It is also an area where there is significant socioeconomic deprivation, which for many young people can lead to more frequent nonengagement in education or training.

Give and Take programme by Include Youth Ireland we're launching today will have a direct impact on those young people most in need, and who require additional support to enter into and sustain employment

opportunities."

# **'SHOW ME I.D - BE AGE OK' SUMMER CAMPAIGN** LAUNCHED AT CIRCLE K LUCAN

Minister of State at the Department of Enterprise responsibility Retail, Emer Higgins TD, recently launched the 2024 'Show Me I.D - Be Age OK' Summer Campaign at Circle K in Lucan Village, showing her support for the country's largest responsible retail training programme.

The launch of the campaign coincides with the summer holidays and encourages retailers and hospitality staff across the country to maintain high standards of compliance around agerestricted products. These include alcohol, tobacco products, lottery tickets and vaping products.

The theme of the campaign the second of four quarterly campaigns by Show Me ID - is the extra vigilance required around vaping products, in response to the ban of these products for minors in December 2023. Failure to comply with the new legislation can result in fines of up to €4,000 or up to six months in prison. Retailers are also being advised to prepare for the possibility of underage test purchasers being sent from the HSE to verify compliance with the new laws. This practice was reminder to retailers and

April of this year.

Retail and hospitality staff are encouraged to complete the 'Show Me I.D - Be Age OK' online training module, which guizzes users on potential situations they are likely to encounter in trading environment. # BYD DOLPHIN EV IS FULL OF **EASTERN PROMISE**

The BYD brand may be a new entrant to the Irish new car market, but the Chinese company started in 1995 as a battery manufacturer and is now the world's leading manufacturer of new energy vehicles and power batteries. BYD employs more than 90,000 engineers -30,000 of which have either a Masters or Honours degree, with the company granted an average of 15 global patents every day.

RYD has successfully mastered the core technology in the new EV industrial chain, and that means that the power battery, electric motor, electric controller and conductor chips are all made in-house. In fact, over 70 percent of BYD's vehicle components are self-supplied, creating a competitive advantage with regards to build time and margins. BYD's head car designer is the highlyacclaimed Wolfgang Egger, whose notable creations include the stunning Alfa 8C Competizione and Alfa 156 during his time with Alfa Romeo, and the Q2 during his time with Audi. The German native leads a team of immensely talented and creative designers who have given the Dolphin a visuallyappealing European look.

Current Trim Levels.

Presently, the BYD Dolphin is available in Comfort & Design trim levels, with lower-spec Active & Boost trim levels due to join the range soon. Both Comfort & Design variants are powered by the same 60.4kWh Blade produces battery that 201bhp (204PS) and 310Nm of instant torque. In keeping with the demands of modern family life, the only body style available in the Dolphin is a practical 5-door hatchback.

Game-Changing EV Tech.

In terms of size, the Dolphin realistically sits between

traditional B- and C-segment temperature reached only hatchbacks, being slightly longer than the Opel Corsa and Peugeot 208, but marginally shorter than a VW ID.3. The Dolphin is available in a choice of single-tone and two-tone colour combinations (model dependent) that also echo colours inside car to create a feeling of exclusivity. Measuring 4,290 mm long, 1,570 mm high, and 1,770 mm wide, its 2,700 mm wheelbase and short front/rear overhangs combine to give it a more spacious appearance, optimised for space and passenger comfort.

Highly-Efficient Battery.

The Dolphin's highly-efficient 60.4kWh Blade battery is lithium-ion phosphate (LFP) battery which is manufactured by FinDreams Battery, a subsidiary of BYD, and it is claimed to be thinner and safer than typical EV batteries. It boasts a range of 427km (WLTP), with a 30% to 80% fast charging speed of 29 minutes. BYD claims that in a nail spike test where the battery is impaled with a nail, the Blade battery emitted no smoke or fire after being pierced, and its surface


30 to 60-degrees Celsius. In the same test, a threelayered lithium batterv would exceed 500-degrees Celsius and subsequently burned. The e-Platform 3.0 modular car platform that underpins the Dolphin offers improved integration of BYD's proprietary Blade battery technology with an improved pure electric frame with doubled torsional stiffness. It also features a more efficient 8-in-1 module for the drive system, along with a direct cooling and heating system for the battery pack to increase thermal efficiency by up to 20%. This platform is also used to underpin the BYD Atto 3, which was launched in Ireland in 2023, and the recently-launched BYD Seal.

Abundance Safety Features.

Standard across the board is an abundance of safety and advanced driver assistance Cutting-edge features. lighting technology provides a broader beam of light to enhance visibility when driving at night, with High Beam Assist, Adaptive Front Headlights and Follow Me Home lighting as standard. All models come equipped Forward Collision with Warning, Autonomous Emergency Braking, Rear Warning, Rear Collision Cross Traffic Alert and Rear Cross Traffic Brake, Lane Departure Prevention and Emergency Lane Keeping Adaptive Cruise Assist. Control and Intelligent Cruise Control. A panoramic camera gives the driver 360-degree visibility for safe vehicle manoeuvring. Additional driver aids include Blind Spot Detection System, Electronic Stability Control, Traction Control, Hill Decent Control, Automatic Vehicle Hold, and Traffic Sign Recognition with Intelligent Speed Limit Control.

Test Car.

My test car was a Dolphin Design in striking Surfing



tone paintwork. In addition to a genuinely-impressive array of standard features in Comfort trim, key additional standard features in Design trim include a panoramic roof, a smartphone wireless charger and a choice of nocost two-tone paint colour options. The 201bhp electric motor sends power to the Dolphin's front wheels in smooth and fuss-free manner, and a 0-100km/h sprint can be completed in just 7.0-seconds, on its way to a top speed of 160km/h (where permitted). The car steers in a reassuringly direct manner and there is plenty of grip from the tyres when cornering. Thanks to the Dolphin's accomplished ride quality, the ergonomic cabin is a pleasurable place

The gear selector is located at the bottom of the centre console and it is a joy to use. You simply flick the selector forward for Drive and rearwards for Reverse, with the Park function activated by way of an adjacent pushbutton switch. Drivers can choose from Sport, Normal and Eco drive modes which alter the steering weight and throttle response but, no matter what mode is selected, the one thing that remains constant is the sprightly nature of the electric motor. The cabin in the Dolphin has a light and airy feel, with space for up to five occupants. The stylish dash is dominated by a large, 12.8-inch central touchscreen that rotates between landscape and portrait at the touch of a button. The screen responds to touch commands quickly and the on-screen graphics reasonably sharp. are Ergonomically-designed front sports seats and headrests are made from vegan leather, as are the rear seats and multi-function steering wheel. Front seats have 6-way electric adjustment for the driver and 4-way electric adjustment for the front passenger, both of which have shoulder and back support, optimised with body-hugging wings for a more comfortable, wraparound experience. Passenger space within the cabin is equally impressive, as a six-foot tall occupant can sit behind an equally tall driver in relative comfort. The well-proportioned boot has a capacity of 345-litres behind the rear seats, but this increases to 1.310-litres with the rear seats folded down. Its competitive price offering on the Irish market will appeal to ecofriendly motorists keen embrace lower-cost, emissions-free, all-electric motoring. Buyers in the market for a well-rounded, fully-electric compact hatchback should certainly have the Dolphin on their shopping list. It really is that good. # FAMILIES BATTLING RARE CONDITION 'FORCED TO FIGHT FOR STATE SUPPORT'

The mother of a young woman battling an extremely painful skin condition has told how the lack of co-ordinated support from the State has made parents 'prisoners' in their children's lives. Liz Collins from Terenure has had to deal with a multitude of agencies and carers in a 20year battle to secure home nursing care for her daughter Claudia, who endures the most severe form of epidermolysis bullosa (EB).

"Every chapter of Claudia's life brings new challenges, dressings have to be done 365 days a year; it's a horrible place to be, like being stuck in a hole you can't get out of," said Ms Collins, speaking as national EB charity Debra launched its 2025 pre-Budget submission. "EB has shaped our whole lives because it was and still is in control, it is a monster."

Debra, the charity that families supports and

everyone with the painful so it's outsourced. "The genetic condition, claims that the current model of service is pushing families to fight unnecessarily for supports. It insists a ringfenced fund of €600,000 for home nursing care would alleviate some of the heavy burden of the lifelong, incurable disease.

While Claudia, 20, now has a level of home care, her parents do not have a care co-ordinator - also seen as central to joining together the different aspects of care. "Everything is a battle and nothing is straightforward," said Dublin-based Ms Collins. "Carers often feel like prisoners because the current level of care is fragmented, fragile and not properly co-ordinated.

"Many people strongly make their case for support, they might win and get allocated home nursing hours but sometimes there's no nurses to provide these hours. managing of a care package, planning, scheduling and communication is key to looking properly after someone with EB.

People with the condition are missing the essential proteins that bind the skin's layers together, so any minor friction, movement or trauma causes it to break and blister. In Claudia's case (recessive dystrophic EB), skin must be re-bandaged several times a week to prevent blister infection in a painful process taking hours at a time. Debra is also asking the Government to provide a further €95,000 in the 2025 health budget, to include \*€45,000/annum for a specialist outreach nurse who would be able to manage complex wounds and infections for adults in the community, reducing the risk of hospitalisation;
