SOUTH DUBLIN TO BENEFIT FROM OVER €1 MILLION UNDER COMMUNITY CLIMATE ACTION FUNDING

South Dublin is set to benefit from over €1 Million in funding to support initiatives like community gardens, solar energy, EV charging, and community composting, a local Minister has said.

The Community Climate Action programme supports projects which focus on building low carbon communities across the State, and also supports crossborder projects that contribute to climate and energy targets.

Minister for Business, Employment and Retail and Local TD Emer Higgins said: "I am delighted that so many communities across South Dublin have been successful in receiving this funding, with a total of €1,073,000 for projects in our area, especially with-it being Dublin Action Climate Week recently.

Congratulations to these local groups; I am confident this funding will contribute to enhancing our area and advancing our climate goals."

I've worked closely with the team at Recycle IT, South Dublin County Council and Councillor Caroline Brady to organise several recycle events across Lucan, and these events have been hugely welcome by local residents. They have recently held recycling drives in various locations across South Dublin. you can recycle anything with a plug or battery. "These projects are brilliant examples of climate action being taken at a local level in Dublin, underpinned by local authority leadership and community ownership. €27m in funding nationwide will ensure community groups are equipped to improve their areas, save energy, save money, and support their members. 


O'CONNOR CALLS FOR ACTION

Former Councillor, Charlie O'Connor, has called on the community to become involved in protecting the bus service to Tallaght West estates. He was speaking following a meeting of the Tallaght Transport Forum which had heard of 16 incidents involving Dublin Bus in August. The Tallaght Transport Forum meets monthly and is attended by Tallaght Gardai, management and unions of Dublin Bus. Go Ahead Ireland management, management of Luas, South Dublin County Council staff, community and political representatives, Tallaght youth workers and Foroige.

The incidents involving Dublin Bus services covered Blessington Road, Brookfield, Cheeverstown, Fortunestown Lane, Jobstown, Killinarden, Kiltalown,

MacUilliam and Tallaght Village. Among the incidents reported on the Forum report were anti social behavior, fireworks and stone throwing at the buses.

At the meeting, Charlie O'Connor who is a long time community rep on the Tallaght Transport Forum praised the endeavors of Tallaght Gardai in supporting the transport services. He said that everything possible must continue to be done to protect and preserve the services, particularly the Dublin Bus services which had been the subject of the 16 incidents in the month. He added that the local community had a clear role to play as many of the incidents involved children. Charlie O'Connor also said that contact with the local schools was so important in that regard.



FROM TENT IN TALLAGHT TO HOMELESS WORLD CUP IN SOUTH KOREA

Brendan's addiction led to him surviving in a tent, feeling worthless and forgotten, embarrassed and ashamed. At six feet tall, he weighed just eight stone and was a shadow of himself. In just two years, he has completely turned his life around. With the support of his family and Merchants Quay Ireland (MQI), this September Brendan will represent Ireland in the Homeless World Cup in South

For many people who are After completing MQI's homeless, addiction isn't very far away. Sometimes addiction is what brings people into homelessness. For others, the trauma of being homeless can send them into a downward spiral. This can result in a rapid decline in mental health, which in turn can lead to taking drugs to be able to cope, or in some cases, to be able to sleep.

Brendan, former Merchants

Quay Ireland client explains "I had tried many times to become drug free. This time was different, I was physically and mentally broken, I'd given up. I used to pray to my brother who died, 'please just get me, just take me'. One night, my two sisters came looking for me with torches. They brought me home to their house and got me into treatment. That was the start of my recovery journey, and I haven't looked back."

Aftercare Service, Brendan reignited his love football and joined The Irish Homeless Street Leagues. The organisation uses the power of sport to transform the lives of individuals from underprivileged, poorly educated, socially excluded, and conflicted communities.

Brendan continues "We had trials recently and they picked four of us to go to the Homeless World Cup in

South Korea. Once you stay drug-fee, anything in life is possible, I'm living proof of that. I gave up on myself, but my family never gave up on me. Now, I have a job, I have an incredible support network around me and I'm very grateful for that."

The Homeless World Cup will be held in Asia for the first time, at Hanyang University, Seol from 21-28 September. The event aims to help participants move from feeling forgotten to being celebrated on a global stage'.

Carol Casey, Head of Communications Fundraising at MQI concludes "We admire Brendan's bravery for sharing his story, as one of the biggest obstacles our clients face is stigma. So, we hope Brendan's incredible journey highlights that there is always hope, and recovery from addiction is always possible, when people are



given the right support. We are constantly in awe of the resilience of our clients and the adversities they overcome to become drug free. Recovery from addiction is a long road,

a huge achievement and should be celebrated.

We are very proud of Brendan and all he has achieved. We wish him and the Irish team every success in South Korea."

CLONDALKIN VACANCY RATES IN CHILDREN'S DISABILITY SERVICES UNACCEPTAB

TD for Dublin Mid-West. Mark Ward, has voiced his disappointment at the level of vacancies in local services for children with disabilities. Deputy Ward was speaking after receiving a parliamentary question response in relation to vacancy rates in Clondalkin's Children's Disability Network Team (CDNT). The Dublin Mid-West TD expressed his disappointment at the government's complete failure in delivering fully staffed services and supports for disabled children and their families.

Teachta Ward said "One of the biggest issues that parents contact my office with is them trying to get vital disability services for their children. "Vacancy rates for specialist disability in Clondalkin's workers CDNT are unacceptable Figures returned to me show vacancy rates between 14% to 100% across various positions within the CDNT. of physiotherapist,

35% of psychologist, 64% of occupational therapists, 67% speech and language therapists positions are vacant in the Clondalkin area

"There are currently no social workers or behaviour specialists working in the Clondalkin CDNT. "It breaks my heart every time I have to send a letter I received from the HSE to desperate parents , telling them that their child may have to wait years for these vital services. "Children are being denied the opportunity to reach their full potential.

"The government is not doing enough to ensure the recruitment and retention of vital therapy staff to deliver desperately needed assessment of need reports and follow-up therapeutic interventions.

"Following on from this PQ response there is a national trend where there are now 817 staff vacancies in CDNTs compared to 707 in 2022 and

524 in 2021, as indicated in a census report.

"We keep hearing from the Minister and her Government colleagues that they are putting in place the necessary resources to improve the situation in CDNTs, but this census report indicates that the opposite is happening. "The situation in CDNTs is getting worse and worse each year and affirms that the government are failing disabled people in general and disabled children in particular. "This is placing an extremely heavy burden on the staff who are in post as they try to cope with the additional workload placed on them by the fact that over a third of their teams have not been filled.

"The high and increasing level of staff vacancies in CDNTs is undoubtedly the main factor that has led to extremely high waiting lists for assessments and followup services for children. government have

OVER €170,000 FOR SOUTH DUBLIN LOCAL SPORTS PARTNERSHIPS AND ACTIVE DISABILITY IRELAND

Local Fianna Fáil Councillor Costello welcomed over €170,000 in funding for South Dublin Local Sports Partnership (LSP) announced by her party colleague, Minister of State Thomas Byrne. The funding is part of a total of over €5m announced recently in Dormant Accounts Funding awarded to Local Sports Partnerships and Active Disability Ireland.

The Dormant Accounts Funding allows unclaimed funds from accounts in credit institutions in Ireland to be utilised for projects focused on overcoming the barriers and challenges to participation in sport for those who are economically

PEOPLE IN CRISIS DESERVE APPROPRIATE MENTAL HEALTH CARE

Mark Ward TD, has called for better services for people experiencing crisis mental health difficulties. Deputy Ward was speaking following the publication of Sinn Féin's Mental Health Action Plan recently.

Teachta Ward said "Mental health difficulties do not just occur between the hours of 9-5, Monday to Friday. People in crisis often turn to A&E for help. This is not always the most appropriate place for someone in crisis. "In recent weeks, Sinn Féin launched our Mental Health Action Plan where we focused on key issues for crisis intervention. "What we need is 24/7 care. This can consist of community-based multidisciplinary services to provide rapid assessment and varying degrees of support to people who are in a mental health crisis.

"Our cities need to be resourced with Crisis Cafés. places where medical professionals are based within the community. "We also need services for when a person is a danger to themselves or others. I have highlighted the positive impacts that a pilot programme for a crisis de-escalation team was in Belfast several years ago and have called for similar teams to be available across the state.

"The teams can be deployed to assist the Gardaí where necessary and appropriate. These teams would comprise of mental health professionals and a paramedic. These professionals can make the most appropriate interventions and referrals where necessary.

"A pilot programme in Limerick has been promised for the last two years but has not been delivered. This must now be prioritised. "If a person does need to access the emergency department in mental health crisis, then Sinn Féin would fund liaison psychiatrists in each ED around the state. "A priority of ours is to fund the National Clinical Programme for Suicide Intervention, which has not received new funding for several years. "Sinn Féin have a vision and plan for delivering crisis intervention. and we will deliver this if in Government."

For those DEIS schools that are not eligible for the accommodation grant, they will receive separate funding of €50 for each shortlisted project, to a maximum grant of €500 per school. Entrants will need to





The Arts Council announced recently that 184 new schools and Youthreach centres across Ireland will join its Creative Schools programme including St. Bernadette's National School, Clondalkin. This brings to 1,100 the number of Irish schools who have participated since the programme began in 2018.


