# **CUTS TO CHILDCARE COSTS TO BENEFIT OVER 150,000**

Families across the country are set to benefit from reductions to full time and early learning childcare services, a Senator has said. As of September 1st 2024, all families accessing registered early learning and childcare will receive a minimum hourly universal National Childcare Scheme (NCS) subsidy of €2.14 off their out-of-pocket costs, up from a current hourly rate of €1.40.

Senator Mary Seery Kearney said: "Our goal in Fine Gael is to support families across Ireland by reducing the economic pressures of childcare. These updates to the National Childcare Scheme are a direct response to the needs voiced by parents across the country, ensuring that every child has the opportunity to thrive in a supportive early learning environment."

"As part of this commitment, families the scheme and acknowledges the diverse receiving the NCS universal subsidy will see a further 25% average reduction in the cost of using full time early learning and childcare services. "For families on the universal subsidy, this will mean up to €5,007 off their annual bill per child. This represents up to an additional €1,731 off the annual cost of early learning and childcare per child following the most recent changes.

"This initiative will ensure that more families can benefit from the valuable early learning opportunities that shape the foundational years of children's lives. "Additionally, starting in September 2024, families using registered childminders will be able to avail of the NCS for the first time-a move that broadens the scope of childcare needs of modern Irish families.

"Fine Gael continues to champion the welfare of Ireland's families, reinforcing its promise to ensure that every child receives the best possible start in life. "This is coupled by €331m Core Funding provided directly to early learning and childcare services works to ensure that providers can continue in their work while providing fee management and financial transparency.

"By reducing the burden of childcare and expanding access to quality services, we are making a strong investment in our children's future and in the economic wellbeing of families across Ireland." Senator Seery Kearney concluded.

# **PUBLICLY FUNDED HRT SCHEME A "GAME CHANGER"** FOR WOMEN'S HEALTHCARE

L

Local Fianna Fáil Councillor Costello Teresa has welcomed reports that her party colleague, Minister for Health Stephen Donnelly, plans to introduce a publicly funded hormone replacement therapy (HRT) scheme. Under the scheme, the Government would cover the cost of HRT medication being available to those who need it.

Cllr Costello said: "The publicly-funded HRT scheme will be a game-changer

for women's healthcare. This is hugely welcome news. "There has been an increase in demand for HRT medicines in the last number of years, both due to public information campaigns run by the Government and to the work of many individuals, organisations and public representatives in highlighting the need for better menopause care for women.

"However, women have faced issues in using HRT medicine, from access to cost disparity. "These issues are in addition to the already challenging experience of menopause. It represents a significant change in the reproductive system and brings with it a lot of other symptoms. everything from hot flashes to weight gain, hair loss, anxiety, depression, sight loss, arthritis and diabetes.

"The scheme would put an end to the barrier posed by costs in accessing effective essential healthcare and

treatment. Women are faced with costs of €30 to €70 per month for HRT, the cost of a GP visit which can be between €60 and €80 and the cost of having to have to go to a consultant which could be hundreds of euros for one consultation. "Publicly-funded HRT is an investment in the individual health of those women who access the medicines as well as in the health of families and entire communities.

### **GOVERNMENT FAILING TO DELIVER SOCIAL HOUSING IN SOUTH DUBLIN**

TD Mark Ward has said that the government is failing to deliver social housing after new figures showed that 19,884 people in South Dublin are on social housing lists or in receipt of Housing Assistance Payment (HAP). Deputy Ward added that the only way to start fixing Fianna Fáil and Fine Gael's mismanagement of the housing crisis is with a change of government, a Sinn Féin Minister for Housing and Sinn Féin's alternative housing plan.

Teachta Ward said "Figures released in recent weeks show that 19,884 people in South Dublin are on housing lists or in receipt of HAP. This is further evidence of the government's inability to fix the housing crisis and their failure to deliver social housing for those who need it. "The report, published by the Parliamentary Budget Office, estimates that the number of social homes across the state must be increased by 56 per cent just to meet the current deficit, yet only last month Taoiseach Simon Harris inexplicably claimed that a sufficient volume of social housing was being delivered.

"These figures rubbish the Taoiseach's claim and show just how out of touch he and his government are when it comes to their failures to address the housing crisis. "But none of this will come as a surprise to those struggling to put a secure and affordable roof over their heads. Fine Gael has been in government for 13 years, Fianna Fáil have been propping them up for the last eight years.

"Two weeks ago alone, three independent reports were released by the Society of Chartered Surveyors of Ireland, the Central Statistics Office and Savills. These reports once again highlighted that the government's housing plan is not working. "The three reports highlight sky high house prices, chronic undersupply and the growing affordability challenge for working people looking to rent or buy a home.

"During all of that time, house prices, rents and homelessness have risen to historic highs. Meanwhile, the delivery of social and affordable homes has been unacceptably low. "Sinn Féin has an alternative housing plan that will priortise the delivery of social and affordable housing to the level that is required. That is why we need a general election, a change of government and a Sinn Féin Minister for Housing.'

# **€1M PROGRAMME NEEDED TO STOP YOUTH VAPING 'EPIDEMIC'**

A dedicated quit vaping service is urgently needed to save thousands of teenagers lifelong nicotine from addiction, campaigners insist. In its pre-Budget submission, the Irish Heart Foundation said dedicated support is vital to help young people quit one of the most addictive substances on the planet. The charity also wants the price of cigarettes increased to €20 a pack and promised new taxes on vapes set at a sufficient level to deter young people from starting to use them.

"We know that many young people are looking for help to quit vaping and from programmes in the US that when such help is available, it can be highly effective," said Irish Heart Foundation Director of Advocacy, Chris Macey. "Failing to provide this support in the face of a youth vaping epidemic the State has not done enough so far to prevent, would be tantamount to abandoning

thousands of teenagers at of youth vaping, has helped risk of long-term addiction."

Mr Macey said the HSE is continuing to receive calls across all its stop smoking services from people looking for help to quit vaping. But despite growing demand, he the said Ouit.ie isn't resourced to provide the service, which requires different approaches than traditional smoking cessation services to be most effective. The Irish Heart Foundation also pointed to data from youth information and support platform, Spunout, which has received thousands of views of its webpage on the health effects of smoking and vaping - with the search query 'how to quit vaping?' the biggest driver of traffic to this content.

The charity also said that a US programme, 'This is Quitting', launched by public health NGO, the Truth Initiative, to counter the rise

over 750,000 young vapers.

"Vaping can affect teenage brain development, damage blood vessels, cause high blood pressure, changes in heart rhythm and have serious effects on the respiratory system," said Mr Macey. "Worst of all, research shows it is a gateway to smoking, which is still claiming 12 lives every day in Ireland, making it our biggest cause of preventable death. "Our concern is that the increase in vaping, relentlessly marketed to teenagers with around teenagers 16,000 different flavours, will increase smoking rates and expose our young people to premature death from tobacco-related diseases."

The Foundation is also calling for a budget allocation of over €1 million to develop vaping prevention information campaign and a research programme to inform the development

а vaping cessation of programme. It wants an increase of €3.25 in the price of cigarettes to bring the cost to €20 per pack.

Mr Macey also said smokers should be given more help by the State to quit - while they pay €1billion in additional taxes, annual anti-smoking

measures amount to just €17million.

People Before Profit welcomes the news that South Dublin County Council rejected planning has permission for Google Ireland to build a new data centre at Grange Castle Business Park in Clondalkin. Insufficient national grid capacity and lack of renewable energy are among the reasons for refusal. Gino Kenny TD said "The development of new

data centres will make it next to impossible for Ireland to meet its climate targets. The average data centre uses the same amount of electricity as 23,000 homes. By 2028 they are expected to use 27% of all electricity in Ireland.

# **TALLAGHT SCHOOL STARTS ACADEMIC YEAR** WITH LIFESAVING CPR SKILLS

A number of Dublin schools are beginning the new academic year with an Irish Heart Foundation award for training their students in the lifesaving skill of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

students Local from Kingswood Community College in Tallaght were one of the schools to receive CPR 4 Schools awards, which recognise schools, teachers and students for remarkable efforts in CPR promotion and training. They were among 36 schools across Ireland presented with 57 awards as part of the national heart and stroke charity's CPR 4 Schools programme.

Since its inception, 2,630 teachers in 649 post-primary schools have taken part, learning how to deliver CPR and giving the programme a reach of over 350,000 postprimary school students. The charity aims to build a generation of life savers by

training students to perform CPR and respond in a cardiac emergency, use an AED (defibrillator) and respond when someone is choking.

"We implemented the CPR 4 Schools programme in Larkin Community College for the first time this year," said Larkin Community College CPR 4 Schools Co-ordinator, Johanna O'Dowd. "In March, ten staff undertook the training online and in just three months, we have empowered 75% of our student body with the invaluable skills of CPR, AED usage and other life-saving techniques. "We believe that by equipping our students with these essential skills, we are not just shaping their futures but also potentially saving lives. "This initiative marks a significant step towards creating a safer and more prepared community."

Brigid Sinnott, Resuscitation Manager with the Irish Heart Foundation, said the charity

is delighted to recognise schools, teachers and students. "Every year we are blown away by the work and commitment of schools to teach the lifesaving skill of CPR. "We know that schools are busy places but they are making CPR a priority for their students and the impact is seen in their homes and communities.

"The Irish Heart Foundation's mission is to build a nation of lifesavers through CPR training and schools are vital in helping us to achieve that. "These schools are, quite literally, the beating heart of the programme and are recognised for empowering students with a vital lifesaving skill."

A person's chance of survival is doubled when CPR is started immediately. By learning CPR once in your life, you are 10 times more likely to respond to an emergency than someone who has never received



People Before Profit TD has called for the HSE to find a long-term resolution for the future of Lucan Lodge Nursing Home. In May of this year the HSE took over the operational status of nursing home after the the previous care provider went into liquidation. Over the summer the HSE

stated that all residents who were residing in the nursing home would be found alterative appropriate accommodation. To date there is still fifteen residents in the nursing home. The HSE announced in July that there were numerous issues with the building, and this was not conducive

to residential nursing care. There continues to be ongoings protest by family members of those residents still residing at Lucan Lodge. Dublin Mid-West TD Gino Kenny has raised this issue with the HSE and the Minister over the last three months said," The situation at Lucan Lodge Nursing Home is very unsatisfactory. A resolution needs to be found by all parties involved. In a response to a parliamentary question, I submitted to the HSE regarding costs that the HSE has accrued since taking over the facility , the HSE stated that from the 17th of May to the end of June that additional direct costs accrued were 600K. Obviously this is an enormous amount of money that the HSE are liable for after the previous private care provider failed in their operational obligations. Considering the costs thus far it would be in the interest of the HSE and residents to consider taken over the facility so it could be used for public use in the immediate and long term".

### **NUNC RENTS POLICY HUR** H

Councillor Willima Local Caret recently highlighted Dublin County South Council's rents policy. In a recent example of the effects of the new rent differential policy, the cost to one family has seen their rent increase from €70 to €236 per week.

However, with the additional surcharge being added of €147 it has now risen to a total of €383 per week. This represents a massive 62.3% increase at a time when increase in rent pressure zones are limited to 2%. As a result of a new policy on assessing household rents, larger families are struggling to meet the new levels imposed by SDCC. These new rent assessments imposed by FF/FG led council came into effect from 1st April 2021.

The effects of which are only now beginning to hit home with tenants whose children are now entering the workforce. These assessments are beginning to cause huge stress on families struggling to pay these additional costs. The differential rent scheme has

always meant that as family income rose so to would the rent they pay. Rents are assessed on all income going into the home.

However, the new policy is aimed at adding a surcharge of an additional 10% of income to be levied upon families. This policy has meant that families whose income had grown above qualification base lines would be hit with an additional 10% surcharge. In effect all income brought in by adult children in a household is now subject to a 20% differential rent. This is a doubling of the rent that they would reasonably be expecting to contribute to the family home.

This is exorbitant rent even in the private sector whereby a family with 5 adults and additional children in the home could be paying such levels of rent to the local authority.

In the height of the Covid pandemic Fianna Fail and Fine Gael pushed through these changes in SDCC rent

differential scheme. This resulted in what is seen as punitive charges been levied upon families with adult children living at home. This also includes charges upon those teenagers and youth who take up part time jobs to support themselves as they progress through school.

Cllr William Carey has been hugely critical of this policy and raised this during the November 2020 debate on the annual budget. Cllr Carey continued, "I identified the problems that this policy would raise including the unfairness of it and pointed to the unjust nature of the additional charges being levied. I also made clear that the increase would have a detrimental effect on family dynamics and that these increases would land on the shoulders of some of our lowest paid workers, ie, young worker's entering into the jobs market".

November 2020 at Cllr Carey added "I had a motion before the 2020 budget meeting opposing this measure which was defeated by 23 votes to 14. Those who

opposed my motion were led by the Fianna Fail/Fine Gael coalition and supported by Green party including Joanna

Tuffy of the Labour party (see below copy of motion taken from minutes of 2020 Budget meeting). Cllr Carey finished by noting that in the past 5yrs since rental income in SDCC has risen from €26m to €31.2m pa".

Union Students' (ISSU) cannot support the proposed plans of a blanket-approach phone ban across secondlevel schools in Ireland announced by Minister for Education, Norma Foley T.D.

A system where students would have their phones removed for the school day is one that the ISSU cannot support, as there are major logistical concerns surrounding it. Furthermore, the majority of schools already have strategies in place to combat extensive use of mobile phones.

Speaking recently, Jack McGinn Uachtarán of the ISSU said "The proposal of a blanket phone ban in second-level schools is not feasible. It means adding another responsibility on the system to police phone usage. It could also mean

schools having to accept responsibility for the safety of up to 1,000 mobile phones each day. No consultation has been made with relevant stakeholders regarding this.

Mobile phones are often used during the school day for educational reasons too, with Junior Cycle CBAs and Leaving Certificate projects in subjects' requiring use of the internet. The Department of Education should focus on expanding the IT Support Grant to enable schools to purchase more IT facilities for students."

The Korando e-Motion is the first fully-electric vehicle from KGM, and its presents itself as a competitively-priced mid-size SUV that offers a perfect balance of performance, practicality and comfort.

#### Spacious & Practical Cabin.

The new Korando is far removed from its predecessor and is decidedly more capable and likeable than before too. With an overall length of 4.45m, a height of 1.63m, a width of 1.87m (excluding door mirrors), and ground clearance of 17cm, the new Korando makes quite an impact on the road.
