CHILDREN WITH SCOLIOSIS NEED MORE THAN ANOTHER

TD for Dublin South West Seán Crowe has criticised the Government for the disgraceful manner in which it treats children with scoliosis and spina bifida.

Teachta Crowe said that An Taoiseach Simon Harris made a commitment seven years ago to these children and asked if it was just another empty promise. Teachta Crowe said "The treatment of children with scoliosis and spina bifida who are waiting for surgery is disgraceful. These children wait in agony for operations that can save and change their lives and the longer they wait, the worse their condition gets.

"It is a race against the clock and against the child's condition becoming inoperable and the prospect of

many children in this awful situation. The case of Harvey Sherratt, an 8 year old boy who has scoliosis and spina bifida and was removed from the waiting list for surgery without his parents knowing, has rightfully received a great deal of media attention in recent days. Harvey is unfortunately not an isolated

"At the Health Committee recently. I raised the issue of a child who was faced with a weeks-long wait just to get an MRI in Crumlin Hospital.

"In general, there is a lack of transparency around waiting lists, including hidden lists and a lack of data collection on why people are removed from waiting lists. "It has been seven years since Simon Harris as Minister for Health promised children with scoliosis that they would not wait longer than 4 months for surgery. An Taoiseach is good at making promises but we have yet to see him deliver on any of them. Parents of children with autism, scoliosis or special needs have all tired of hearing his promises.

"Last February, Sinn Féin put forward a plan for paediatric orthopaedic services that would eliminate waiting lists in cooperation with parents, advocates, and clinicians. The Government voted against that plan and here we are more than six months later and things are only getting worse for children like





BASKETBALL IRELAND GRANTED PLANNING PERMISSION FOR €38M REDEVELOPMENT OF NATIONAL BASKETBALL ARENA

Basketball Ireland has been notified by South Dublin County Council of their decision to grant planning permission for the €38m redevelopment of the

National Basketball Arena. The project will see the multi-sport and multi-use arena double its capacity to 3,272, with works expected to take 18 months to

complete.

The 8000 square metre facility will have space for four basketball courts, house a gym, café, corporate

facilities and office space for Basketball Ireland staff. The Arena will be fully accessible and inclusive and has the backing of a number of sporting bodies, including Volleyball Ireland, Badminton Ireland and Irish Squash, who all wish to use it.

Basketball Ireland CEO, John Feehan, said: "This is excellent news and a major step forward in bringing the new National Basketball Arena to fruition. The Arena will be transformative for Irish indoor sport, providing state-of-the-art facilities that will be on a par with our European counterparts.

Feehan added: "We haven't finalised when the Arena redevelopment will commence, with financing a key element and we remain hopeful of Government support for the project through the Large Scale Sport Infrastructure Fund (LSSIF). We expect news on whether we've been successful with

our LSSIF application in the coming weeks and that will help inform our next steps."

Basketball Ireland chairperson, Prof. Seamas Donnelly, stated: "This is an important milestone for basketball in Ireland. Having a new Arena is key part of our 5-year Strategic Plan and is essential to help maintain the growth of the

sport. Our registered playing population increased 21.5% last year alone and revenue generated from the Arena will filter down to every area of the game.

"Overall this is also a huge boost for Irish indoor sport, the new Arena will provide a best-in-class amenity, which is crucial as we all continue to strive for excellence."

People Before Profit the watch councillor Darragh Adelaide condemns the government's Retrofitting a way to funds. It was revealed in September's Council meeting that funding for South Dublin County Council's retrofitting scheme has been reduced by about 45% since 2022. Cllr Adelaide said: The cuts to the Retrofitting Programme for Social Housing is disgraceful, especially under

the watch of the Green Party, who championed the Retrofitting programme as a way to "reduce carbon emissions by half".

In 2022 the council was allocated €5.1 million with a target of retrofitting 146 homes. In 2024 this was cut to €2.8 million with a target of only 83 homes. 61% of a household's carbon emissions come from

heating. Adelaide added that "Retrofitting homes is both a means to reach our climate targets and cut down on energy costs during the cost-of-living crisis."

Gino Kenny, local TD for people before profit added "Allowing cuts to the retrofitting programme shows that rather than looking out for our environment, the Green Party serves to greenwash government environmental failures"





Cosán education centre in Jobstown, Tallaght, has provided a Firhouse mother with an anchor following the loss of her husband to cancer two years ago. Sharing her story of empowerment through adult education with over 100 golfers at An Cosán's 26th Golf Classic at Powerscourt Golf Club, Patricia Bailey said she couldn't believe the support An Cosán had given her.

"An Cosán has given me an anchor when I felt so untethered in life, and opportunities to get excited again about my future," she said. "I know the skills and confidence I'm gaining with An Cosán will help me get a good job."

Ms Bailey, who initially completed a 12-week Discover Your Path course and who is now in her second year of a QQI Level 5 course in Business Administration with

Digital Skills for Work, said she was hugely grateful not only for the free courses, but also the additional supports offered by An Cosán. "The community spirit and support of An Cosán is next to none," she said. "They offer a fully holistic approach to adult community education with one-to-one mentoring and counselling services. I got a loan of a free laptop, and IT support too."

Ms Bailey said the Discover Your Path course was exactly what she needed after losing her husband Phil. "I had given up my career in beauty therapy to be his carer through his long battle with cancer, as well as looking after our young son," she said. "A free 12-week course of self-discovery and confidence-building, re-discovering my skills, strengths and values with support to create a path forward to further education and/or work, was exactly

what I needed because, somewhere along the line, I had lost my confidence and felt so untethered.

"I met so many lovely women from all different backgrounds on the course, all with their own story to share, all wanting the same thing as me - personal development and a better future through education," Ms Bailey continued. "I felt a real sense of belonging. I made a promise to myself starting this learning journey and just turning 40, that I'd take up any opportunity that came my way and push myself out of my comfort zone. Well, it worked and I got offered an internship with Goodbody stockbrokers, which was extended throughout the summer. I really enjoyed my time there."

Reflecting on the past 18 months, Ms Bailey said: "I can honestly say I don't

know where I'd he without the An Cosán team. I tell everyone who will listen just how amazing An Cosán is and how life-changing it has been for me and my family. My 10-year-old son is only delighted I must do homework too, and likes to remind me to get the laptop out and study! It's been so inspiring watching him look up to me, knowing education doesn't stop at the school gates and is a lifelong iournev."

An Cosán CEO Heydi Foster said "Patricia is the change we see at An Cosán every day. Her words show the world of possibility we want every individual and family to have access to."

Recognising that not everyone faced the same odds in life, Ms Foster went on to say that An Cosán worked to remove barriers and support people in overcoming hurdles. "Even if you're earning the minimum

wage in Ireland, you probably make less than €1,700 a month. That could all go on rent in many places. You may be struggling with your mental health. In Tallaght we have the highest rate of suicide for young women in the country. Getting the skills to find a better paid job is not easy for someone who is struggling to hold everything together.

"If you are a migrant, a Traveller, a single parent, trying to beat an addiction or cope with a childhood trauma, the barriers you face are many, even in our 'affluent' Ireland," Ms Foster continued. "At An Cosán we look at each individual person and see what they need to succeed, and we support them so they can do so."

Anna Durkan, Chair of An Cosán's Board of Directors, said: "An Cosán is all about giving opportunities to learners - adults and children - to develop skills and confidence so that they have choices in life.

Starting off in 1986 with the aim of lifting the people of West Tallaght out of poverty through the empowerment of education, we are now working with communities across the country. supporting learners from every county to achieve their potential, while working at a national and policy level to address the digital divide so that everyone has an equal chance.'

Ms Durkan continued: "We couldn't do this work without our generous supporters and without funding from SOLAS, the Department of Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science, Pobal, Tusla and the Dublin Dún Laoghaire Education and Training Board."



A supply drought in Dublin has reignited the commuter property market as buyers battle to secure affordable family homes, the Q3 REA Average House Price Index has found. Frustration in the capital has led to the return of the previously unheated commuter market, which has risen by 2.9pc over the past three months to an average of €336,944. And further afield, large towns such as Ennis, Tralee, Tullamore and Athlone have experienced average increases of €20,000 in the past three months.

The REA Average House Price Index concentrates on the sale price of Ireland's typical stock home, the three-bed semi, giving an accurate picture of the second-hand property market in towns and cities countrywide. The actual selling price of a three-bed, semi-detached house across the country rose by 2.7pc in the past three months to €323,741. Time taken to reach sale agreed nationally has dropped to four weeks as low supply continues to drive sales. Actual selling prices in Dublin city rose by 1.3pc in the last three months, and the average three-bed semi in the capital is now selling at €532,333 - an annual increase of 7.4pc. The number of sales in the capital due to landlords leaving the market has

risen six points to 24pc in the past year, the Index revealed, but some areas are reporting a figure of over 50pc. "Lack of stock in Dublin has accelerated bidding in the commuter belt, with a number of counties such as Meath, Louth, Carlow and Kildare experiencing their largest quarterly rises of recent times," said REA spokesperson Seamus Carthy.

"There has been a drought of properties on the market in Dublin over the summer - the lowest seen in years according to our agent Anthony McGee of REA McGee. "Average selling time in the capital has fallen from five to four weeks, but in many cases it is as low as two. "A lot of stock in some areas is ex-rental and landlords are keen to close as soon as the bidding hits their expected figures - so while properties are moving, we are not necessarily seeing the rises that you might expect.

"While there is activity on every property, it is not as intense as people may believe and we feel that moderate increases in supply would take the heat out of the current market. "One area where we are seeing improvement is in the turnaround time for probate, which has been has previously been frustrating for potential buyers.
