TD INTRODUCES NEW LEGISLATION TO REDUCE MISUSE OF NITROUS OXIDE

TD for Dublin South West Seán Crowe has introduced new legislation in the Dáil that would restrict the sale of Nitrous Oxide products in an attempt to reduce the harm that the widespread use of the gas is having in our communities. Teachta Crowe co-sponsored the 'Sale of Nitrous Oxide and Related Products Bill 2024' with fellow TD Mark Ward of Dublin Mid-West.

While introducing the Bill in the Dáil rcently, Teachta Crowe said "The sale and misuse of Nitrous Oxide is something that often slips under the radar in the fight against substance abuse in our communities and efforts to help those who suffer from addiction. "Even though it ranks among the top three drugs used by young people, it garners very little attention by the

nedia.

"We will all have seen the evidence of its use and its growing use. From the small silver bullets we used to see scattered by footpaths and in green spaces, to the large, thermos sized plastic containers that have taken their place. "The use of this gas has led to death and serious long-term harm to people who have used it to achieve a quick high. It is predominantly young people who use it as it is cheap and easily accessible.

"I had previously put forward a Bill banning the sale of nitrous oxide to under 18s and I was astonished that the government were wholly uninterested in achieving that goal. "Minister O'Gorman even wrote to me last year to tell me that, in his view, the current legislation is working fine and that my Bill was somehow unnecessary.

"Nitrous oxide is not a harmless substance. Prolonged use can have extremely damaging effects on the body. These include disorientation, impaired memory and cognition, and weakness in the legs. This worsens as the body is leeched of vitamin B12 and can lead to permanent afflictions like foot drop as the nervous system is eroded over time.

"There have even been direct fatalities from hypoxia as the nitrogen displaces the oxygen in the blood. "Nitrous oxide is not safe, but it is incredibly prevalent and it is time we started taking it seriously."



NATIONAL CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL PROJECT **'NOTHING SHORT OF SHAMBOLIC'**

TD for Dublin South West Seán Crowe has expressed his anger and frustration with the lack of progress of the new National Children's Hospital, both in terms of the huge cost overruns and the long delays that have been only longer and longer, saying that the hospital should have been finished two years ago and could cost three times more than the original cost.

Speaking after chairing a meeting of the Oireachtas Health Committee with the development board of the hospital recently, Crowe said "There are two simple questions that people ask about the National Children's Hospital; when will it be finished and how much will it cost. The CEO of the board couldn't give me answers in the Oireachtas Health Committee and frankly, I don't think anyone at this stage can.

"The whole project has been nothing short of shambolic from day one. This hospital was meant to be open and treating sick children

two years ago.

"Only in recent weeks we heard that of the more than 3,000 plus rooms that the developer BAM was supposed to have finished, not one has been accepted by the board as being ok. "And then there is the huge cost of the building. This hospital was budgeted at a cost of €980 million in 2017. Now, it is almost two and a half times that at a whopping €2.2 billion. And there is no doubt in my mind that the final figure is going to be even more.

"Irish tax payers are paying for the crazy costs of how public contracts are awarded, looked at, and hopefully completed in this state. "My worry now is that the contract for the new National Maternity Hospital is currently out to tender and we can't afford to repeat the same mistakes again or the maternity hospital will not be completed within the next decade and who knows at what cost.'

OCTOR FROM TALLAGHT UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL RECEIVES MAJOR EUROPEAN AWARD

Dr Adam Dyer has just been presented with the "Stefania Maggi Award" at the 20th European Geriatric Medicine Society (EuGMS) Conference for new research which has implications for the diagnosis of early Alzheimer's disease. Dr Adam Dver, a Specialist Registrar in Geriatric Medicine and Irish The Stefania Maggi Award Dr Dyer received the

Fellow (ICAT) at Tallaght European Geriatric Medicine University Hospital (TUH) & Trinity College Dublin (TCD) has just received a major European Award for new research which has important implications for the detection of early Alzheimer's disease.

Conference, which has just taken place in Valencia. Spain. The award is given to the best research performed by Early-Career Geriatricians across Europe. Dr Dyer is the first Irish recipient of the award.

Clinical Academic Training was awarded at the 20th accolade for the findings of a

new study which took place at the Institute of Memory & Cognition at TUH. The research demonstrated that it is possible to use a blood test to detect "proteins" that build up in the brain of individuals with Alzheimer's disease.

It is hoped in the future this will reduce the need for some patients to have more invasive procedures such as a lumbar puncture (spinal tap) to confirm the presence of these proteins. Currently, only a lumbar puncture test can detect "amyloid" protein which builds-up in the brain of individuals with early Alzheimer's disease. This is an invasive test and carries certain risks such as post-procedural headache.

Dr Dyer examined the performance of a new blood test - called plasma P Tau217 - to detect amyloid - one of the proteins that make-up "plaques" in the brains of people with early Alzheimer's disease. his research Dr Dyer, used samples generously donated by 108 individuals over the past two years to assess whether blood tests could detect the same proteins using lumbar puncture. The study found the blood test for P-tau217 was over 90% as accurate as diagnostic lumbar puncture to detect this amyloid protein.

Dr Dyer says, "Our study found that blood tests such as plasma P-Tau217 demonstrate excellent performance in detecting the changes characteristic of Alzheimer's disease. In the future, clinical use of these blood tests may enable us to avoid invasive tests such as lumbar punctures in over half of individuals who currently have these procedures performed."

of the Institute of Memory & Cognition at TUH says, "Our Institute has a research "biobank" whereby people who have symptoms and are undergoing this lumbar puncture for clinical reasons can volunteer to donate a cerebrospinal fluid and blood sample for future research. This is important as there is now strong evidence that blood biomarkers of Alzheimer's Disease may be as good as lumbar punctures - although this is usually in research cohorts, very few studies have been conducted in "real-world" memory clinic settings. This is why the samples and data collected in the TUH biobank

TD CONDEMNS OUTRAGEOUS 'AFFORDABLE' HOUSING **COSTS IN KILCARBERY, CLONDALKIN**

People Before Profit TD for Dublin Midwest, Gino Kenny, has voiced his anger and frustration over the high cost of socalled 'affordable' housing in Kilcarbery, Clondalkin. Homes at Kilcarbery Grange, built on land that was originally owned by South Dublin County Council and sold to a private developer, are being offered at prices far beyond the reach of ordinary working people. "It is outrageous that these homes, which are being marketed as affordable, are still priced at nearly €300,000. This is not what affordable housing should look like. The people in our community deserve better," Kenny stated.

Kenny criticized the sale of council-owned land to private developers, a decision People Before Profit firmly opposed. "We voted against the sale of this land because we wanted 100% social and genuinely affordable housing on the site. Instead, public land has been handed over to private interests, who are now selling homes at prices that most families simply cannot afford," he said. "This is a betrayal of the people who need housing the most and flies in the face of our vision for sustainable, equitable housing development.

South Dublin County Council has released details of five 3-bedroom duplexes and one mid-terrace house being made available for purchase under their affordable housing scheme. Prices for the homes, which are reduced from their market value, still range between €286,940 and €306,940, with the council setting household income limits between €69.221 and €73.046, "Even with these reductions, these homes are unattainable for many in our community. This is a failed approach to housing, and it's time we put public land to public use," Kenny concluded.
