# **'MORE OF THE SAME'' SDCC** BUDGET FOR 2025

People Before Profit has strongly condemned the 2025 South Dublin County Council budget, describing it as "more of the same" and a missed opportunity to address the pressing needs of local residents.

The budget, passed by councillors all except People Before Profit for representatives, failed to include meaningful measures to combat housing disrepair and address climate action in council housing.

Councillor Madeleine supported Johansson. Councillors Darragh bv Adelaide, Kay Keane and Jess Spear, had proposed an amendment to increase

housing maintenance and retrofitting while introducing a rate rebate scheme for small businesses, funded by a modest increase in rates for large corporations. This progressive proposal was rejected by the Council majority.

"Our amendment was a common-sense approach to addressing the chronic issues in South Dublin," said Cllr. Madeleine Johansson. "It would have increased spending by €50 million on urgently needed repairs and maintenance for council housing as well as an expanded retrofitting programme to tackle energy

efficiency and reduce carbon emissions. Small and medium businesses, the backbone of our community, would have received targeted relief through a rebate scheme that ensured fairness and encouraged local enterprise. Instead. the Council has chosen to maintain the status quo, leaving vital needs unmet while prioritizing corporate profits over community welfare."

People Before Profit's proposal included a 50% increase in the Annual Rate on Valuation (ARV) for businesses, generating an additional €76.5 million in revenue. €26.5 million would have been ringfenced

to ensure the increase would only be paid by rate payers over €50 000. This targeted approach ensured that the financial burden was placed on major corporations, not on small enterprises or residents.

"The refusal to even consider our amendment shows a lack of vision and a failure to prioritize the needs of ordinary people," Johansson added. "This budget does nothing to address the housing crisis or the costof-living pressures faced by council tenants. People Before Profit will continue to fight for a fairer, more equitable approach to local government funding."

## KILTIPPER PARK PHASE 2 WORKS SOD TURNING EVENT

On the 28th of November, the Mayor of South Dublin County Council, Cllr. Baby Pereppadan officially turned the sod to mark the commencement of the second phase of works at Kiltipper Park.

The Mayor was joined by local Councillors, Ms. Teresa Walsh, Director of Services, and staff of South Dublin County Council. Representatives from the contractor's and designer's teams were also present to celebrate the event. The works about to commence will include the construction of an extended car park; footpath and northern pedestrian entrance improvements; sports pitch construction associated drainage; construction Æ of a new viewpoint area; hedgerow rejuvenation works; and all associated ancillary site drainage and landscaping

works. This phase of the project is funded by South Dublin County Council's 3-year capital budget and supported by The Department of Rural and Community Development through the Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS) and the Department of Sport via Sports Capital Grants.

Clifton Scannell Emerson Associates and Tim Austin Associates have carried out the planning and design work on this project to date. Construction work on site will be carried out by ACS Civils Ltd. 



# TUH AND SDCP LAUNCH NEW PODCAST SERIES $(\mathbf{1})\mathbf{N} \mathbf{W} \mathbf{U} \mathbf{M} \mathbf{E} \mathbf{N}$

A new podcast series from Tallaght University Hospital (TUH) funded by the South Dublin County Partnerships Health Project (Fettercairn) has been recently released which focuses on Women's Health.

The six individual episodes released as part of the Hospital's Let Talk About series look at Endometriosis, the Importance of Cervical Screening, Brain Health and Dealing with Brain Fog, Pelvic Prolapse and Incontinence, Good Heart & Bone Health and finally Menopause.

Those contributing to this series were all highly trained and respected experts in their fields. The speakers included Consultant **Gynaecologists** Aoife O'Neil and Alison DeMaio, Consultant Endocrinologist and Lucy-Ann Behan, Advanced Nurse Practitioners in Women's Health Sinead Cleary, Cheryll Gilmore, and Colleen Byrne as well as Endometriosis Clinical Nurse Specialist Paula Earley.

They were joined by their colleagues Advanced

Nurse Practitioners David Askin (Bone Health) Shirley Ingram (Heart) and Cathy McHale (Brain & Memory). The podcasts also featured Grainne Wall a Specialist Urogynaecology Physiotherapist and the Hospital's Head of Psychology Neuropsychologist, Dr Valerie Twomey.

Consultant Gynaecologist Aoife O Neil, also the Clinical Director of the Women's Health Centre at TUH, said, "I was delighted to participate in these podcasts which cover in detail so many different aspects of Women's Health. Hopefully, by listening to these podcasts, women who are often the primary carers in their families will understand how important it is that they also prioritise their own health."

Launching the podcast series, The CEO of TUH Lucy Nugent said, "I would encourage everyone to listen to these excellent free podcasts where our experts and highly qualified staff share a wealth of important medical

and practical knowledge on each topic. All of the episodes are in keeping with TUH's important mission of becoming a hospital without walls, striving to improve the health of the population we serve."

The podcasts were funded as part of a partnership project between the South Dublin County Partnership Health Project (Fettercairn) Tallaght University and Hospital. As they were being launched, the Coordinator of the Fettercairn Community Health Project Samantha Griffin said, "All of these episodes are an excellent free resource for the public in terms of health promotion and the prevention of illness. I would urge anyone to log in and listen to them because as we all know when it comes to health, prevention is better than cure."

# OAKLEE LAUNCHES FIRST COST RENTAL HOMES IN PARTNERSHIP WITH QUINTAIN

Oaklee, an award-winning Approved Housing Body, has officially launched its first cost rental homes at The Sidings in Adamstown in partnership with Quintain Ireland and South Dublin County Council.

This new development is one of the largest cost rental projects in the country and involves a mixture of 154 one, two, and three-bed

homes. Cost rental housing is designed to provide affordable and secure accommodation for those on middle incomes, with rents based solely on the cost of construction, management, and maintenance.

Monthly rents for the homes at The Sidings apartment development are at least 25% below market rates and range from €1,525-€1,800.



The 154 apartments include 71 one-bed, 81 two-bed and two 3-beds.

Oaklee is delivering the homes with the support of South Dublin County Council (SDCC) through funding from the Department of Housing's Cost Rental Equity Loan (CREL) scheme and private financing from the Housing (HFA). Finance Agency Oaklee already manages over 2,500 homes across 19 counties, but this new development marks its first launch of cost rental homes, a tenure the organisation expects to deliver more of in future. All of the homes are A-rated, high-quality and spacious with fully fitted kitchens and built-in wardrobes.

development The was designed by Henry J Lyons and delivered by Quintain to complement the first phase of development at The Crossings urban village. The Sidings is a nine storey building "gateway" and a visual marker for this new neighbourhood. The architectural design includes balconies, brickwork and active frontages to the Ground Floor level which positively attributes to the street environments and

residents of The Crossings. The Sidings apartment development forms phase 2 of The Crossings, a new urban village located at the heart of Adamstown with a host of services and amenities already in situ and with more to come. Quintain has already delivered 279 apartments in The Crossings, with a further 436 apartments under construction and a fourth phase currently being master planned.

The village centre includes a large shopping centre with Tesco and Aldi supermarkets, individual retail other outlets including McCabes, Grafton Barbers, Urban Vets, Belfry&Co and ABC Gym. The development also includes a public plaza and a three-acre public park while there are several creches and schools nearby. The Crossings is also located next to a purposebuilt train station on the main west Dublin commuter and intercity train lines with excellent access to the N4 and the M50.

Minister for Housing Darragh O'Brien commented, "For Oaklee to be launching its first Cost Rental scheme here in Dublin is hugely welcome. The development in Adamstown will provide secure, high-quality homes which will make a real difference in the lives of more than 150 families and individuals. It's clear that the hard work and effective collaboration between our local authorities and Approved Housing Bodies, such as Oaklee, is delivering the quantity and mix of homes which are needed to meet the needs of our people. Affordable cost rental is a key element of Housing for All and has already been extremely successful in providing stable, affordable, long-term rental homes for individuals and families. A robust pipeline of cost rental homes is now in place and it's through the work of

and it's through the work of AHBs like Oaklee working in collaboration with my department, with our Local Authorities and with our Agencies that we will scale it up even further."

# MOTORING LIFE WITH OTORING VW ID.7 IS A HIGH-TECH ROAD-TRIP CHAMPION



Volkswagen's latest electric family saloon is the strikingly-designed ID.7. Like all VW ID. models, the ID.7 is built on the VW groups' MEB electric vehicle architecture. Loaded with new technology, it has a spacious interior, and offers both a 77kWh and 86kWh battery capacity, depending on which model is selected. It is almost five metres long from bumper to bumper, and a little over 2 metres in width, with a swooping roof that makes it look slick and sporty from every angle. Striking Silhouette.

Despite the fact that the ID.7 has the lowest roof of any of the VW ID. electric models, inside the cabin there is plenty of space, with ample legroom and headroom for up to 5 occupants. Helping to make the cabin more airy is a model-dependent, full-length glass roof with smart glass, where the layers of glass in the sunroof can be electronically switched between opague and clear via a slider in the roof. The spacious, upmarket cabin is dominated by a 15.0-inch colour touchscreen, mounted high up on the dash. Underneath are some touch-sensitive buttons, which are backlit so you can see what you're doing at night. The software operates a lot like a smartphone, there is a configurable homepage with various widgets, and two rows of shortcut keys that can be swapped out to give quicker access to the functions mostly used.

The massive central touchscreen is narrow driver complimented by a information display behind the wheel. This shows the important information relating to speed, range and warnings, while other

functions such as navigation instructions can be viewed through the head-up display. Material and build quality throughout the cabin is excellent. The front seats have been certified by the German Campaign for Healthy Backs (AGR) and are multi-adjustable, with four-way lumbar support, and an extendable seat base to help support longer legs. They are also heated, and come with a massage function as standard. Storage is good with large door pockets which are felt-lined so that items in them won't rattle. There is also a large cubby under the central armrest, while the two hideaway covers in the centre console conceal a pair of cupholders, two USB-C ports and a wireless charging pad. Boot space is also generous with a 532-litre capacity, increasing to 1,586 litres when the rear seats are folded.

#### Impressive Driving Range.

The entry-level Pro Plus (rear-wheel drive) uses a 77kWh (usable) battery pack, the same as what is available in the ID.4 and ID.5, but because of the sloped shape of the ID.7 it offers better efficiency, and has an range of up to 616km. There is an 86kWh (usable) battery pack as standard in the Pro S Plus (rear-wheel drive) and the GTX (all-wheel drive) models, with both models having a potential real-world range of 702km and 585km respectively. Rapid charging is possible at up to 170kW for the 77kWh Pro model. The 86kWh Pro S and GTX models up the charging speed to 200kW for even faster charging ability. VW claims a 10-80% refill in either version is possible in under 30 minutes. Anyone who has a 7.4kW wall-box

charger at home should be able to refill a flat battery (0-100%) in a little over 12 hours for the Pro version, and just under 14 hours for the Pro S and GTX variants.

#### Test Car Details.

My test car was an ID.7 Pro Plus finished in Glacier White paintwork. Standard equipment includes a 15-inch colour touchscreen, keyless entry and ignition, heated front seats and steering wheel, 19-inch alloy wheels, a head-up display, adaptive cruise control, automatic highbeam Matrix LED headlights with dynamic beam control, massaging front seats, threezone climate control and an automated parking system, 'swerve support' automated braking and steering assistance, pedestrian and cyclist detection, blind-spot monitoring, rear cross-traffic alert, semi-automated lane changing, lane-keeping steering, road-sign recognition, predictive speed limiter and a 360-degree surround-view camera system. Optional equipment fitted to my test car included a panoramic glass roof, 20-inch alloy wheels, and an interior 'style package plus pack', which includes ventilated front seats, heated rear seats, front and rear curtain airbags, a centre airbag and a Harmon Kardon sound system. Performance is sufficient, getting from 0-100km/h in just 6.5 seconds (6.6 seconds for the heavier Pro S version) with 545Nm of torque providing the car with instant acceleration from the get-go. The ID.7 is a refined and quiet car with a good driving position and an intuitively responsive accelerator pedal, while the steering is precise and well-

weighted. There are no regenerative brake paddles, but by twisting the drive selector into 'B' mode, the regenerative braking function is greatly enhanced. It is quite strong, but it doesn't go all the way down to a full stop (commonly known as one-pedaldrive). The suspension is soft and compliant, which allows it cope well with speed bumps, potholes and any uneven surfaces. With the appropriate suspension setting selected, the ID. 7 remains remarkably composed, but it never loses its feeling of supreme agility. Impressively, tyre, road and wind noise remains minimal - even at motorway speeds, and this ensures that the occupants within the car experience a near-silent experience on every journey.

#### Verdict, Price & Warranty.

The ID. 7 is highly commendable, zeroemission, family car, that is practical, remarkably quiet and comfortable too. It offers more space and more rolling refinement than many of its direct rivals, yet it dramatically undercuts similarly sized, but more premium competitors in terms of price. The car drives very nicely, and it performs with intuitive ease, while strong ergonomics and high levels of comfort make every journey pleasurable. The ID.7 has received a full five-star safety rating from Euro NCAP with impressive scores in the adult occupant protection category. Prices start at €56,490 for the ID.7 Pro Plus, with motor tax costing just €120 per annum. Like all VW's the ID.7 comes with a 3-year/100,000km warranty, with the battery warranty covering 8-years or 160,000km - whichever occurs first.
