NEW DRIVING TEST CENTRE MUST BE A PRIORITY FOR NEW GOVERNMENT

TD for Dublin South West Seán Crowe has said that the opening of a new driving test centre in South Dublin must be a priority for the new Transport Minister when they are named. Teachta Crowe's comments came as RSA figures revealed that over 17,000 people were on the waiting list in Tallaght testing centre at the start of November.

This represented 10% of the total backlog out 60 testing centres, demonstrating that Tallaght is far and away the

most oversubscribed centre in the state.

Teachta Crowe said "For several years now, I have been highlighting the need for a new driving test centre in south Dublin to cope with the massive backlog in driving test applications. People are waiting six months for a test in Tallaght if they're lucky and it is simply not good enough.

"RSA figures reveal that over 17,000 people were on the waiting list in Tallaght testing centre at the start of November. This represented 10% of the total backlog out 60 testing centres, demonstrating that Tallaght is far and away the most oversubscribed centre in the state.

"Tallaght and Dún Laoghaire are first and third when it comes to the sheer number of people waiting on a test. Additional testers in centres has only stemmed the problem, but it is not a solution. We must have a new testing centre to

alleviate the pressure on Tallaght and allow people to complete their driving test.

"While we should always look to public transport as or first option, that is not always a practical solution for people who are working or taking care of children. We are forcing some to put their lives on hold for want of a simple driving test. Whoever is named the new Transport Minister and whatever form the Department takes, a new driving test centre in south Dublin must be a priority."

REGULATION OF CAMHS MUST BE IN THE PROGRAMME FOR GOVER

Mark Ward TD, has called on the incoming government to include the regulation of the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) in the programme for government. Deputy Ward has called on the regulation of CAMHS to be prioritised within the first 100 days of the new government. Teachta Ward said "Reports emerging that a programme for government has essentially been agreed between Fianna Fáil, Fine Gael and some Independent TDs. "This Programme for government must include the regulation of CAMHS. "The outgoing Fianna Fáil and Fine Gael government failed to prioritise our young

people following multiple reviews and reports into CAMHS which highlighted the need for regulation. They left CAMHS unregulated under the Mental Health Act 2001.

"The Mental Health Act 2001 is outdated, it has long been called for to be reformed and it seems like it was a false promise to do so in the last programme for government over 4 years ago. "There are real life consequences to this not passing. CAMHS is still unregulated under the Mental Health Act 2001, and following the Maskey report and the Mental Health Commission's review into CAMHS, the concern is that

there still is no independent insight or regulation. "The recommendations by the Mental Health Commission were brought about because children were being misdiagnosed, over medicated, falling off that cliff edge at 18. We also have children with a dual diagnosis of autism and mental health, falling through the cracks. "CAMHS needs to be a safe place for children to get help, and the vast majority of staff are working to their best of their ability.

"There are no guarantees to families and young people issues highlighted that in these reports will not happen again. "I introduced legislation that would regulate CAMHS but the government kicked this down the road in favour of their own Bill which they failed to pass in time. Their gamble with young people's mental health has not paid off, and young people will lose out as a result.

"I will be reintroducing my legislation to ensure that the new government does the regulate CAMHS within their first 100 days. "Young people







The title comes from the Greek tale of Orpheus and Eurydice which Clerkin relates back to his own experience of love and heartbreak.

Talking about recording the album, Luke said 'We spent a lot of time recording this album and trying to get it perfect but sometimes that's what got in the way of things. It's ironic because the theme of the album for me is about

getting out of your own way, and honestly, if I kept trying to get it perfect, I probably wouldn't be releasing it! We faced so many other hurdles trying to get it over the line, one of them being a repetitive strain injury that I picked up, which put me out of action for two months. Gav also had some personal issues occur in his life, so I'm very grateful that we got it like a concept piece as it

done and finished.

On the album itself Luke said 'When I was planning the album, I wanted it to have two halves, and I feel that's the way it should be listened to. The first half has some of my oldest songs as well as some new ones written since Covid. The second half is almost explores my journey from an almost love, to something that never was, to the beginning of my first proper relationship and everything that comes with that, two songs for each person and situation. I'm very proud of this body of work and I think it really displays the kind of songwriter and singer that I am, more than anything that I've released before.

The Irish Journal of Education (IJE) is a peerreviewed, open access journal that is published by the Educational Research Centre (ERC). Usually, there are just six articles published per year. First established in 1966 in St. Patrick's College in Drumcondra, the ERC is recognized internationally as a centre of excellence in research, assessment and evaluation in education. In 2025, it was established as a designated statutory body of the Department of Education.

The study entitled "Mental Health Among Third-Level Students in Ireland During COVID-19," presented by Dr David Mothersill, Dr Gerard Loughnane, Dr April Hargreaves, and Hau Nguyen aimed to examine levels of mental ill-health and predictive factors of mental ill-health in third-level students in Ireland during COVID-19. Many factors were considered in this study such as relationship status. LGBTI status, pre-existing mental health conditions, and various life factors

stress disorder (PTSD), post-traumatic complex stress disorder (CPTSD), depression, or anxiety.

"Working in academia I am very aware of the various difficulties that our students face. We have already seen a steady decline in the mental health of young people globally over the past 20 years; from a mental illness prevalence of approximately 15% to a prevalence closer to 50%. The worry was that the COVID pandemic and its resultant loss of the important social networks that students spoke of, would exacerbate this mental health decline." ~ Dr April Hargreaves, Associate Professor of Psychology at

The mental health of 268 third-level students during COVID-19 were examined in this study through logistic regression analysis. This study found that, given prior evidence that social isolation predicts negative mental health outcomes, and the association between negative change in social life and probable negative mental health outcomes observed in our study, future research should examine ways of increasing

engagement among students attending online and blended third-level courses in Ireland. A key finding to this study is that students who reported a negative change to their social life experienced greater levels of mental ill health than their peers who reported either no social change or a positive social change. This is important as it suggests that it is not the change in social interaction itself that causes difficulty for a person's mental health, it is the perception that the change in social interaction is negative.


